#### VICE PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Fall flying has been touch and go with the weather; the good weather days more than making up for the lousy ones. Bob Rice's contest was fairly well attended on a sunny and breezy day. Just completed was Jim Monaco's first annual Pro-Am contest. This contest format pitted two man teams comprising a Masters level pilot with a novice. Each timed for the other with the intent of the novice benefitting from the Masters instruction and experience. It was a fun experience that blended low level competition with casual, fun flying.

With the 1998 season winding down, several year end activities require attention. First off, is the annual RMSA Awards Banquet. This year's event will be held on December 6, from 10:00 am to 1:30 pm at the "Old Country Restaurant", same place as last year. Cost for the Sunday brunch is \$12.48 per person; this includes tip and tax. The "Old Country" is located at: 134 Union Blvd. in Lakewood. If you plan to attend, please get your checks into John Pearson by November 27th so that we may get an accurate head count for the restaurant in advance. In addition to presentation of the award plaques for each of the competitive classes, we will be raffling off a number of prizes.

Second, plans and preparations for the 1999 contest season need to commence. Thanks to all those individuals who contributed to the conductance of the 1998 contest season. Your efforts and willingness to contribute to the clubs activities are welcomed and much appreciated. It is hoped that many of you will volunteer your CD services

again. In the coming weeks, I will be arranging a combined contest/CD meeting with the goal of reviewing the contest rules, modifying them if appropriate, and scheduling the 1999 contest season. I hope that some of the membership will consider taking the AMA CD test to become a contest director and volunteer to CD one of next year's contests.

Third, the time has come to improve the operation and performance of the club winches. The least that will be done over the December-January time frame is to have the winch motors rebuilt. Arrangements will be made to have this done. Thought needs to be applied to the platform architecture. As they are now, the club winches are bulky beasts that consume a lot of volume in a car, truck or van. Perhaps a simpler, more economical means of mounting the motor/line spool assembly can be implemented. And while we're at it, the line spool brake mechanisms merit some re-work. Winch keepers must inspect their equipment thoroughly prior to each use. At the Pro-Am contest, a turnaround was placed that was lacking one of the two bolts that anchored it to the ground. This was an unsafe device that may have caused a crash during launch. Thanks to Mark Howard for noticing it and replacing with another. During the period when the motors are being rebuilt, I suggest having the winch and retriever batteries load tested to weed out the marginal batteries from the robust and replacing them with new ones.

The board welcomes all suggestions for the continued improvement of the club and its activities. Please attend the club meetings and bring up any thought, ideas, or suggestions that you think bear discussion.

## 1st Annual RMSA PRO/AM

Well, the 1<sup>st</sup> and hopefully annual RMSA PRO/AM is over and I would say it was a great event. I had been wanting to try this event for some time, so Bob Douglas suggested that I use the fall funfly to give it a go and it turned out quite well. We had 10 flyers show up for the whole day, with several others wandering in and out as well. I intended this to be a low-key event, providing lots of flying for everyone, a lot of mentoring for our less skilled pilots, and an opportunity for our skilled pilots to have fun flying and helping out the club. It seems to have worked.

The morning dawned cool and overcast, and stayed that way until about 1:00 when the sun popped through and started the thermals brewing. Everyone pitched in and we had 2 winches set up for the predicted wind and held one back in case the wind shifted, which it did. Mark Howard then set up the 3<sup>rd</sup> winch about 180 degrees and we were able to generally launch into the wind. One more winch change to the east, with the help of Rick Stillman, and we were pretty set. We moved the landing zones around a bit for safety, but everyone went with the flow and there were no problems.

Barbara Keer did the honors of randomly selecting the teams with the final matchings:

- 1. Jim Monaco and Rick Stillman for Team Monaco
- 2. Mark Howard and Marc Monaco for Team Howard
- 3. Lenny Keer and Mac Arthur for Team Keer
- 4. Charlie Miller and Greg Merkle for Team Miller
- 5. Matt Sheldon and Mike O'Hearn for Team Sheldon

With marginal weather, we had a 5 minute first round where the Pro could fly but 1 scoring flight, while the Am could make as many flights as possible within the 50 minute window to get the best flight.

The other 4 rounds were 6 minutes each and each flyer got 1 attempt to record an official score. To ensure plenty of flying, after recording an official score, any flyer could funfly all they wanted within the restrictions of frequency control and all scoring flights had priority at the winches. This worked out great and a lot of flying was done. We packed it in after 5 rounds by group consensus at 2:30, but everyone flew more flights than that during the day!

In the end Team Keer led the pack with Lenny doing a great job of coaching Mac to an excellent performance. Marc Monaco had a radio failure in the first round and lost his Spirit and was relegated to flying the beat-up TG-3 foamie for the rest of the contest, making Mark Howards coaching job that much tougher.

I received a lot of positive feedback on the contest from those that attended, including the Pros. One person suggested doing this 2 or 3 times during the year... That is probably a bit much, but I think we will definitely put it on the calendar for early spring and use it as a tune-up for the contest season and to encourage our newer members to come out to fly the contests... Thanks to all our Sportsman and Masters flyers that came out - this kind of activity is not possible without your support and I and the novice flyers appreciate it greatly.
