

you folks don't drink that much beer. Until we find an alternative, we will continue to meet at my (Boulder) office. At the last meeting, several executive decisions were made. We decided to purchase a fifth winch to insure that our contests keep their man-on-man structure. We got a good deal on a winch identical to our own from a club member. This purchase will serve us well. However, our efforts to acquire "real balls" continue to suffer from fiscal realities. Accordingly, I would like to ask every pilot who flies competitively to consider pledging \$10 to outfit all five winches with "real balls". This would preserve battery condition during busy contests, provide smoother, stronger launches, preserve the winch motors and establish parity with most of the other large competitive clubs which mostly all have them. Please send your contributions to my mailing address or send your pledge to my e-mail and I'll collect from you next time I see you.

Other decisions made include a potential new recommended approach for contest trophies. This new system would award a standard RMSA plaque to each 1st through 3rd place contest winner for the year in each class and subsequent wins would be rewarded with a gold "additional event plate" to be added to that person's trophy for the year. So a person who placed in any contest would get one plaque, but additional contests would be commemorated on the same plaque with an additional metal inscription. This is an idea, which might be more cost effective and allow some contest revenue to be returned to club coffers to maintain club equipment. This idea is only a recommended approach and could be reversed by any CD who chooses a different approach. During the January meeting, we also decided to buy a club banner (everybody else has one) and decided that club leadership would push for sanctioning RES competition. Many of you have expressed interest in the RudderElevator-Spoiler class and some rather "techno" looking models have been showing up at RES events both locally and nationally. Interest in RES nationally is at an all-time high. Accordingly, the attendees of the January meeting suggest that the club vote on this issue in time to allow the first RES event to be one that would count toward year-end point totals.

So there you go. Another jam-packed RMSA newsletter to whet your appetite for that rising hot air. As the year progresses, please let Jim and I know how we are doing. We want to do our best to see everyone get as much out of our hobby and our club as possible. Based on the enthusiasm that I've seen so far on the field, we are off to a great start. Lets try to get some more bodies to those meetings.

Zagi Spring Fest Fun Fly



Getting Started With the Stylus By Tom Hoopes

I am assuming that your new plane has four servos in the wing and that you are using the glider card with the Stylus.

If so, you will want to use the 2A2FER template found in the wing-type menu. The left flap should be plugged into receiver channel #6 and right flap into receiver channel #5. Before messing around with launch menu, first make sure that all of the trims are centered, flap stick to the top of the transmitter, flight mode switch in normal position, both sliders pulled forward to their inactive position.

Second, go to the centering menu and make sure that all of the surfaces are initially set to 0%.

Third, make sure that ALL of the servos are moving the correct direction when the sticks are moved.

Fourth, move to the EPA menu and adjust the total travel close to their targeted movement.

Fifth, apply full landing stick and adjust right and/or left flap travel in the EPA menu until the flaps are deploying the desired amount. Push the flap stick back up to the inactive position.

Sixth, apply half of the camber travel with the left slider set at mid point. Scroll to the camber menu (CAMB) and adjust the aileron travel (LA/RA) until the ailerons match to the flaps. Leave the flap travel (LF/RF) alone at 100%. Move the slider through its full travel and verify that the ailerons and flaps are tracking in unison. When you're happy with the alignment, scroll to the EPA menu, last selection (CB-D) and with the left slider fully deployed (away from you) adjust the percentage until you achieve the desired camber travel.

Seventh, you did get the centering as close to zero mechanically as possible didn't you? If so, move to the centering menu and center everything.

You still need to setup the aileron-to-rudder mix, flap-to-elevator compensation, launch mode (camber, flap, elevator), reflex mode, and lock VRs that are active that you don't intend to use. Other than that, you should see everything working okay. If you get in a bind, I have a template that disables the "goofy" stuff, enables the proper functions as well as adding a few nice features (i.e. audible warning if camber is one while in reflex, landing practice cadence counter, landing disables launch mode, etc.) and normally takes about 10 minutes for a complete setup of a new plane. Let me know if you need the setup and I'll give you the details how to get your memory card to me.
