The often rescheduled "Easter" HLG contest was finally held on Sunday April 29th. We were greeted with blue skies and high temperatures. Unfortunately, the winds were also fairly high in the early morning. The weather gods were smiling on us though, as the



winds got lighter throughout the day instead of stronger as expected! Lift was sporadic and everyone had trouble making his times. We flew 6 rounds using the same tasks as day 1 from the International Hand Launch Glider Festival. It was a fun day of flying with NO midairs, probably because Shannon couldn't make it and we all kept a sharp eye out for Bob 'crash' Lewan. Several new flyers attended with Jim Newcomb flying in his first contest ever.

Interestingly, no one used a discus launch. This puts us a bit behind the development curve compared to the rest of the country. Skip did show us a couple of throws with his new bird at lunch. Although he has less than an hour of practice at this new technique, he was exceeding his overhand heights by a noticeable margin. I think the change is coming!

The scores stayed quite close throughout the contest with the outcome in doubt until the last round. Actually the real results were in doubt even longer. Unfortunately, in the heat of the battle, I made a very unfortunate addition mistake at the contest. I accidentally added 1100 points for one round win (that would be a VERY good score). The real champion (and current series leader) was none other than Skip Miller. Joseph Newcomb, the only junior flying, had a SUPERB contest and finished second, not first as originally announced. I apologize to Joseph on my lack of math skills and I encourage everyone to congratulate him on his fine performance. I'm sure he will be challenging Skip again soon!

#### **April HL Results**

#### F3J in the Rockies – 2001 Mark Howard - CD

Over the Memorial Day weekend, we scheduled and achieved three days of flying. We had folks in from the Northwest US, Canada, New Mexico, and Colorado Springs, as well as a great turnout by RMSA. Some of these guys have participated in the US and Canadian national teams, Interglide, and the world championships.

On Friday, I went out to the sod farm early to finish trimming out my Escape and do some team practice with Jon Padilla and Rich O'Connell. Pilots from around the region filtered in to practice for the contest and attend Skip's f3j clinic which started about 12:30 and went for about 3 hours. Skip covered the basics of f3j from the equipment through the launch methods to strategy. Thanks Skip! Arend Borst showed everyone a new launch technique that complies with the FAI/AMA safety restrictions (banning the use of stakes), but gives an acceptable result.

Saturday morning, after a brief pilot's meeting, we began two rounds of open f3j competition that were only briefly interrupted by the sprinkler and a concerned sod farm worker (who was worried about the towmen trampling some freshly-planted grass). The foreman turned off the sprinkler, and we adjusted the launch corridor. The air Saturday morning was pretty typical - just a little light on lift.



With a few notable exceptions, most pilots were getting their times. Charlie Miller had a bit of bad luck in round one when his Xantapa spun on launch. We got in two rounds of open and two rounds of sportsmen before the lunch break.

Lunch was a bit late, and we ran another two Sportsman rounds as it cooked. A group reflight delayed things a bit further. Seems that Fred McClung's Escape needed an in-flight makeover - the only mid-air of the contest. The mid-air was initiated by a gust hitting Chuck Auerbach's plane - causing it to veer on launch across Fred's path. We finally returned to the open groups about 2 PM - time enough to complete just one round before rain forced evacuation of the field. We waited a while to see if it would improve. It did not. Oh well - off to the Buffalo Run clubhouse for a brew to wrap up the afternoon. A pretty good day if a bit slow-paced.

Sun morning - we had a quick pilots meeting to make a couple of key decisions. I'd originally intended to carry over the scores to the fly-offs -- the same as we'll be doing for the team selections. I put this question to a vote and the overwhelming majority wanted the flyoffs to start fresh. Then we had to decide on the number of pilots in the flyoffs as there was a serious shortage of support personnel - not enough to support 10 flyoff teams. We settled on 6.

We quickly set up and were in the groove for 3 open rounds in quick succession. We started a 5 minute countdown to a new working time just as soon as the last working time was complete. With this method, we were able to finish the 3 rounds in just about 3 hours. During these 3 rounds, lift was sporadic and there were far fewer maxes than on Saturday. There was a high haze and a bit of wind that hampered mature thermal development. If you were to look at the raw scores, you would notice that in the Saturday rounds, there were lots of ten minute maxes; while on Sunday seven minutes could win a group.

The weather was closing in after the 3 open rounds were complete, so I decided to go immediately to the flyoff rounds and finish the Sportsmen (and lunch) later if possible. This proved to be a good call as the weather deteriorated throughout the flyoff rounds and eventually became unmanageable.

Flyoffs - The wind increasing throughout the three 15 minute rounds, and conditions got more and more challenging. We divided resources amongst the six teams as best we could. Skip Miller volunteered to help the RMSA pilots. Jon Padilla was top dog - but chose to work with another team, so I got the next shot at Skip for crew and I took it!

Round 1 - I had a pop-off on launch (Skip and I both thought it was a line break, but it was not). I did not get a good launch and had to relight at about 3 minutes. On the relight I got a good launch, 12 minutes or so and a good landing. During the flight, Skip kept me posted on the other pilots progress. Jon Padilla had a great flight going - but then landed way out in mounting winds. I really felt bad for Jon who had done such a great job up to that point. As for the first launch, my plane had actually picked up Shannon Bingham (my pulley towman) off the ground, and he lost his footing. Shannon finally achieved what man has always dreamed of - FLIGHT! Certainly NOT his fault. We used straight tows for the rest of the event. Guy Russo and Bob Moffett had good times for the round with Bob edging Guy to take the round. Great flying Bob! Arend fared just a bit better than me by about 50 points.

Round 2 - My launch was textbook - found a nice thermal shortly after launch and skied big time. Arend did the same. We both spent beaucoup time hung way out downwind. I had a mediocre landing and dropped another 50 points to Arend who was now firmly in the driver's seat. Nobody landed out, but several pilots had sub 700 scores which hurt their cause a bit. Guy Russo and I were virtually tied for second place at 1750 points; with Arend Borst about 100 points ahead. It would all come down to the final round.

Round 3 - OK launch but not real high - not great air on launch. Arend had a killer launch. The wind had now increased to the point that wave flying was probably in order. I followed Arend upwind for a while - but much lower. I found a couple of minutes of wave lift, and eventually found myself pushing through some incredible sink and falling fast. Almost everyone else was way downwind by now following "thermals". Skip had the chute ready and was recommending a re-light with the idea that the group would probably all relight and the first plane back up would likely win the round. However, I found a small thermal and went downwind with it. I followed it a fair way out climbing slowly - mindful of the difficulty of the return trip. Skip kept urging me to follow as far back as I could. I probably didn't get as far as Skip would have liked, and I finally started back anyway - slowly at first. I pushed more and more against the mounting wind and finally made some headway. I arrived back just west of the field to find Arend waiting. He then went south with 5-6 minutes to go. I went north where Jon Padilla was gaining. Arend must have hit a big sinkhole. He fell out with about four minutes to go. I got all of the time but choked the landing in the wind. Guess I'll need those ballast bars next time! It turns out the four minute gap was enough to edge Arend out of first place. Guy Russo had really bad luck with a zero for the round. And that as they say was that. Skip did a fantastic job of calling the air and following the competition.

Unfortunately, the wind really picked up and the rains came as soon as the flyoff rounds were finished. We were unable to complete more than four rounds for the sportsmen - no rounds on Sunday - and no lunch on Sunday. For that, you guys have my apologies. I wish the situation was different, but I cannot change the weather!

Ali Ghaffari won the sportsman class. A fine accomplishment for Ali who hasn't been at this all that long. Larry Laughlin from PPSS finished second. It should be noted that Fred McClung never got his second reflight (broken line) and could have taken the sportsman class with a reflight win. We're still looking for Chuck Auerbach's scorecard which was last seen in the vicinity of Goodland Kansas traveling at a high rate of speed eastward.

Thanks to Skip Miller for the Friday clinic, Jim Monaco who scored all weekend, Tony O'Hara the safety officer, Dr. Dan Williams who ran the flight line on Saturday, Chuck Auerbach who ran the flight line on Sunday, Jon Padilla who brought the food, Shannon Bingham who brought the drinks, and Lenny Keer who has the loudest horn in five states.
