Electric Soaring competition comes to Denver!

One of the fastest developing areas of R/C in that last few years has been electrics. The performance has been improving rapidly, and now an electric motor is a totally viable method for launching a sailplane.

The first **Electric Soaring World Challenge** contest was held in Phoenix in October. This event was very well received by everyone and is sure to be getting bigger each year. The format is quite simple. A timed motor run to altitude to make a ten minute duration task and landing, flown man on man.

During 2002, RMSA will host a series of four contests following the same format. We'll total up the best three contests for awards at year's end. More importantly, this is a great opportunity to practice the event and fine tune equipment to make a good showing in Phoenix next year. These will be AMA sanctioned contests, and are likely to bring in participants from outside the club.

Contest Dates

March 23, 2002; May 18, 2002; July 20, 2002; September 14, 2002

Rules

The complete set of rules used in the ESWC can be found at http://www.f5jelectric.com/. I'll summarize them below including a couple of local modifications.

Flight Task

The flight task is 10 minute duration, including the motor run time, to be flown man on man. Landing points will be added, then each flight group normalized to 1000 points. The launch master will signal the start time, motor off time, and end time. Landings will be on the FAI landing tapes (a smaller bullseye landing was used in Phoenix).

Airplane Classes

In Phoenix, three airplane classes are flown. SP400, 7 cell, and unlimited. For the Denver contest series we will have two classes. The 7 cell will be combined with the unlimited class, but 7 cell airplanes will still get a longer motor run. Pilots will be able (encouraged, in fact) to enter both the SP400 class and the Unlimited class. The rules address the power system only and there are no restrictions on the airplane itself. Nylon skegs are permitted.

Unlimited Class

Any motor can be used.

Motor run time is 20 seconds.

(7 cell models will have 40 second motor run)

SP400 Class

Only 400 sized ferrite motors allowed. 8 cells or less. Motor run time is 60 seconds.

Club Business

At the December Open CD meeting several items were discussed as follows:

- 1. The 2002 Club Event Schedule was set see the calendar at the end of this newsletter.
- 2. Contest guidelines are clarified as follows
 - a. RMSA points are awarded in club contests based on the normalization of the flyer's score to the winner's score. In the event that a non-RMSA member wins the contest the scores are still normalized to the winner score.
 - b. Season points for F3J format contests (with flyoffs) are calculated and awarded as done for the 2001 season. In summary flyers that do not make the flyoff are awarded their points normalized to the winner of the preliminaries. Flyers making the flyoff have their scores calculated by giving each flyer a base score equal to the normalized score of the lowest flyer to make the flyoffs. The difference between the base score and 1000 (called the Delta Points) is used as the base for the flyoff points. Flyoff scores are normalized to the flyoff winner score and that percentage is multiplied times the Delta Points for the flyer giving Flyoff Points. Flyoff points are then added to the Base Score to arrive at the flyers final points for RMSA contest standings.
 - c. Pop-offs are to be handled in a consistent manner as follows:
 - i. One pop-off per contest for Masters and Sportsman and one per round for Novices (same as currently).
 - ii. Master and Sportsman pop-offs will be rescheduled to a later flight group.
 - iii. Novice flyers may relaunch in the same group at the CD's discretion.
 - iv. If rescheduling is not possible (such as for the last flight group in a round) the entire flight group will be reflown.
- 3. An electric competition series will be flown this year Lenny Keer is coordinating that set of events. See elsewhere in this newsletter for details.
- 4. We may try to hold a national level open thermal duration contest during the Memorial Day weekend. Confirming this is dependent on attaining cooperation of Sod Farm Managers to assure the ability to conduct a large event within Sod Farm Operations alternate venues are also being considered.

Current RMSA Contest Guidelines

PURPOSE

- 1. To help members develop flying skills by competing against an equally skilled group.
- 2. To allow advancement to a higher level skill group.
- 3. To challenge all members to develop their design, building, and flying skills.

RMSA CONTESTS

RMSA usually schedules at least one contest per month, March through November. Tasks are chosen to provide variety and challenge for all skill levels. At the beginning of each year, the Board of Directors normally obtains AMA sanctions for nine regular monthly contests to be counted toward season points. The Board or individual contest directors may from time to time also request or schedule additional specialty contests. All AMA/RMSA sanctioned contests will count toward season point totals and awards. Specialty contests, fun flys, etc. are non-sanctioned and thus non-point events.

NON-RMSA CONTESTS

The Colorado Challenge Cup is normally held in August or September and sanctioned by the club holding the cup for the year and is a counting event regardless of the club holding the event. To encourage AMA members to participate in national level competitions, any national contest spanning two or more days with 30 or more contestants may be counted towards season total points.

Contests must be of a class compatible with the RMSA class they will be counted against, e.g. Open Thermal Duration (including F3J and F3B) for the RMSA Open class, or HLG for the RMSA HLG title.

ONLY ONE NON-RMSA CONTEST CAN BE COUNTED TOWARDS SEASON POINTS TOTALS!!

CLASSES

Novice New members with limited flying experience. Novice pilots are limited to Rudder-Elevator-Spoiler sailplanes. Pilots

flying full-house sailplanes are automatically promoted to Sportsman.

Sportsman Members with contest experience and have advanced by contest points.

Master Member having advanced through contest achievement from other classes.

NEW MEMBER CLASSIFICATION

At AMA/RMSA contests, all members are expected to identify themselves as novice, sportsman or masters pilots based on the above guidelines. New members should elect to place themselves in the Sportsman class if they are accomplished RC pilots (power or glider) or have had significant prior contest experience. The Novice class is intended to encourage new flyers to enter the club contests. New members with vast contest experience may petition the Board to be placed directly into the Master class.

RECLASSIFICATION

Members may petition the board for consideration of changing classification either up or down based on extenuating circumstances. The board will examine the merits of the petition and make a recommendation based on fairness to the member and other competitors.

ADVANCEMENT

Class points are given as follows;

1st place in class = 3 points

2nd place in class = 2 points

3rd place in class = 1 point

Advancement to the next class requires the following:

- 1. Novice to Sportsman = 12 points and 1 class win or 3 class wins.
- 2. Sportsman to Master = 21 points and 2 class wins or 4 class wins.

In all cases there must be at least three competitors in your class to be counted towards advancement points. No class points are carried forward at advancement, however class points are carried forward to the next contest year.

STANDINGS

Normalized scores from each contest will be used to develop advancement points and annual awards. Annual awards shall be given at least through third place in each class. Only the six best Open contests are counted towards annual Open points. For Handlaunch only the best 3 contests are counted. In addition only one of the special noted contests may be counted toward the six best.

The RMSA club champion shall be recognized as a true champion pilot, showing both skills as a pilot and the willingness to compete against his peers inside and outside of RMSA. Points for the club champion trophy shall be computed from the total of the normalized, documented scores from all AMA sanctioned contests entered during the year by that competitor. Normalized points from outside contests must be documented, signed by the contest director, and submitted to the club scorekeeper prior to November 15 for that contest year. Annual awards shall be given in the class where the pilot spent most of the year. Example: If the pilot advances from Sportsman to Master by virtue of contest points during mid-year, he/she will be eligible for an award only in the class where he/she spent the majority of that year's club contests. In the event of a tie for any standings, co-champions will be declared.

- 1. The sod farm operations take precedence over ALL activities. We use the field at the convenience of the owner.
- 2. All members will follow **ALL** instructions from **ANY** sod farm personnel without question.
- 3. When sod farm operations are occurring during a flying session it is **OUR** responsibility to ensure that we will not interfere with operations. If it is unclear as to what is happening or where they intend to mow or work try to talk to workers or management and always move equipment or vacate the premises if necessary. Some workers do not speak very good English in that case you must make every effort to avoid conflict or interference with operations.
- 4. Park only in the designated parking area on the southwest corner of the field. Do not park on grass, dirt or roads.
- 5. Avoid setting up on newly seeded areas or young grassy areas. The nice grassy areas are better to land on anyway!
- 6. Establish a frequency control pole and tag system! Frequency control is to be in effect at all times!! All members will post their frequency control tags on the pole and if there are conflicts, please exercise safety sense as well as share the flight time.
- 7. Parking and pit areas should be as condensed as possible for the safety of launch and landing.
- 8. Establish flight line areas for winch launch, high start launch, and hand launch that are separate for the sake of launch, flight & landing safety.
- 9. Flying over the parking/pit areas at less than 30 feet is prohibited. Doing so in competition WILL result in a zero flight score and during R/R flying a disciplinary action by the club.
- 10. No aerobatics or speed runs over the parking/pit/Launch/Landing zones.
- 11. Do not launch if a plane is circling in a launch zone: vacate the launch zone as soon as possible if someone is waiting to launch.
- 12. When entering a thermal occupied by other aircraft, enter in the same direction as the first aircraft
- 13. Landing aircraft have the right of way!
- 14. In the event of no mechanical retriever, please shag your own chute/line for the flight
- 15. Please share the usage of club equipment so that all have equal flight time.
- 16. Please be courteous and helpful to your fellow flyers as well as informative to all guests/spectators. Enjoy yourself and others!!
- 17. Absolutely no debris or trash is to be left on the field! Please take it home with you for disposal.
- 18. Make sure that your plane and electronics are airworthy before each flight. Exercise good safety sense in your flight
- 19. The aircraft will have an identification name/address or AMA number on or in the model in case of loss.
- 20. Please tag your winch/high start spikes or stakes with fluorescent tape so they are easily spotted on the field by all concerned.
- 21. Absolutely no alcoholic beverages will be consumed, prior to or during participation in any model event on the flying field.
