- Classes: Two classes will be flown. Pilots may enter one or both classes. Sp400 Class for stock speed 400 motors only and up to 8-cell battery. 7 cell/open Class for any motor and cell count. (7-cell models limited to 7 cells)
- **Motor runs:** Sp400 class will have 60-second motor run time. 7 cell models will have 40-second motor run time. Open class models will have 20-second motor run time.
- Task:The task is to climb to altitude in the allotted motor run time, and remain aloft for a total of 10
minutes. Each flight group will be scored together, man on man.
- Landing: FAI landing tapes will be used, 5 points per meter.
- **Raffle:** We will have a separate raffle of electric related items at the December awards banquet. Raffle tickets will not be offered for sale; you'll have to enter the F5J contests to receive them. Each paid entry will receive one Ticket. August Club Contest CD's Report – Bob Lewan July 14th, 2002

My plan for the contest was to set up the winches as close as possible to the parking area for the convenience of the pilots, and to fly at least 6 rounds. As I arrived at the field, it was apparent that in order to do this we would be launching down wind. Now if only the sprinkler would behave itself. The winches were re-strung and we were flying by 9:30am. Since the air was kind of iffy to begin with, the early morning tasks were 4 minutes. The tasks throughout the day never exceeded 7 minutes, in order to get in 6 rounds at a reasonable hour.

Slowly the wind shifted around to the east and we began to get head-wind launches, the air was steadily improving. Most people had no trouble making their times. By 2:00pm we had completed all 6 rounds. We put it to a vote whether or not to fly a 7th with a throw-out. Most everyone wanted to fly, so off we went. I set the time for the round at 3 minutes and was instantly chastised by most pilots for setting such a short time. I got my revenge when most of the pilots in the first group didn't make their time (now they were complaining that it was too long).

When all was said and done, everyone seemed to have a good time. The sprinkler did behave itself, and we never had to move the winches.

Attendance was light again making it difficult to fly rounds of standard hand launch tasks. I would really encourage others to attend as the contests really are a fun affair with plenty of flying for all. We flew straight thermaling tasks with 36 rounds of 3 minute maxes. We flew 4 sets of 9 flights with 4 throw outs. Everyone launches together for a true man on man contest. Actually, we had a slight twist on that as both Joseph and Jim Newcomb flew, so Jim would launch his son, then quickly is own plane. Once again, we couldn't have done it without JoEllen Newcomb who timed everyone's flights. Her expert services are appreciated by all.

Jack Zika entered a discus plane with just a small amount of practice. Give him a bit more time and he'll be trouble. Jim flew Joseph's backup plane to great effect. He had many 'surprises' by sneaking off for some successful climb outs! Greg flew his own design javelin launch, but practice damage limited his results. Joseph had a tough day without ever really getting out. I flew my old faithful fat airfoil with a total time for the 32 flights only 8 seconds different than last month.

Handlaunch Contest Report August 25th by John Kappus CD

Sunday the 25th was the first handlaunch contest of the year to use traditional, big contest, tasks. We had 9 fliers making for 2 flight groups. The day started out overcast but quickly burnt off yielding a perfect day of thermaling with light, changeable winds.

We flew 7 rounds with the first 6 being from day 1 of the IHLGF in California. Four of these rounds included something new for this year, penalties for additional throws. This added a challenge to devise the best strategy for the round. Some even required quick figuring to decide if another flight would help or hurt your score. The first task of the day had no time limit within the 10 minute window. First up, both Skip and Joseph showed how it is done with 9:59 flights!! That's a tough act to follow. This also marked the kind of day that Joseph would have. He thermaled extremely well and was nearly perfect in all the rounds. Check out round 6, where the luck of the draw pitted the top 4 fliers against each other and Joseph came out on top! The contest stayed very close throughout and was only decided in the end. Congratulations to Joseph for his first HLG contest win. It was well earned! I'm sure this won't be his last.

To prove that I can't get through a contest without one scoring mistake, Lenny moved back in the standings when the extra 1000 points inadvertently added to his score were removed. (The page one total was incorrectly copied to page two when the 7th round was added.) At least the error wasn't to Joseph's score for a change.

Everyone started the contest with discus launch planes for the first time ever. Greg and Jack both had problems later and finished javelin. Skip, Joseph, and Jim all flew Raptors. I flew my own design. Shannon flew an Encore and Lenny flew a Taboo. Jon Padilla, who arrived for the second round, flew an interesting ship, the aileron XP-3 from Polecat Aero.

After the regular DLG contest, it was time for Nostalgia Class. Javelin launch ONLY ! We flew 5 flights of 2 minute max. Skip brought out his beloved Mirage, and I flew my sub 7 ounce V tail. Skip and I both fondly remember the flight characteristics of those planes. Well – I think that is mostly memory. The wind came up the first couple of flights and the planes just hung there. You couldn't go anywhere (without ballast). I was also surprised to rediscover how much harder javelin launching is on the body, and that was just 5 flights. Flying is also much more of a crapshoot. On one flight, Jack and I thermaled out while Skip and Joseph had 20 second flights. You really have to launch right into lift, there is no second chance.

I think the lesson there shows the advantages of discus launch, even on the body. It also isn't hard to learn with Jack and Greg picking it up quickly this week. So get a plane and come out and join the fun!


