At the next meeting we will discuss the pros and cons of using a throw out and create a summary for distribution to members. We will then vote via email on whether to allow throw outs in club F3J contests. I would like to close this issue prior to the next club contest in April.

Format: This will be a fun-fly type event. No entry fee, no awards.

Classes: Two classes will be flown. Pilots may enter one or both classes. Sp400 Class – for stock speed 400 motors only and up to 8-cell battery. 7 cell/open Class – for any motor and cell count. (7-cell models limited to 7 cells)

Task: Man on man electric soaring event based on F3J rules. We'll fly 10 minute rounds with unlimited motor run. Duration time commences following the motor run.

Sport Flying: I'm planning to make the field available for sport flying during the contest <u>except for frequencies in</u> <u>use by the contest flyers.</u>

Cyprus Open 2005, F3J in Turkey

In case you haven't noticed, Turkey has become something of a world power in F3J, finishing in second behind Germany in the last world championship. They keep interest in the sport high by hosting an international invitational F3J contest which was held this year on March 3-5th. The top pilots from the world are welcomed to an expense paid test of skill. 106 pilots participated with a USA team comprising, our own Skip Miller, Joe Wurts, Larry Jolly, and Jim McCarthy. Unfortunately, the current world champion David Hobby was not able to attend.

After 6 preliminary rounds with one throw out, Skip was in first place ! Scores for the US were:

Open Contest Report, March by Jim Monaco

The weather forecast was great for this rescheduled event, and we were flying F3j so I expected a great turnout, but apparently the change in schedule conflicted with spring break commitments so only 10 pilots attended this contest.

Since there were only 10 pilots we flew groups of 5 with the other 5 pilots as timers. There was a choice of strategy for line retrieving since there were not enough pilots to also fetch the lines. Some pilots chose to send their callers/timers down the line during the prep time to hurry back with the lines after the launch. Others chose to keep the timers near them until they were established - then send them down to get the lines in case of a relight... The conditions were quite challenging. We had a strong overcast with occasional showers moving thru. There were periods of great lift and also much sink. Some rounds were won with 4 or 5 minute times. In accordance with F3J rules we allowed 1 throw out and in the end Skip Miller won 1.5 points ahead of me... Mike Verzuh did a great job pulling in third place, and Bob Lewan edged out Don Ingram for 4th place. Don finished "in the wood" in 5th place in his first contest in a long time. It was good to have him back. Steve Suntkin was the lone sportsman pilot and did a great job. In round 2 Steve put a serious hurting on his group, getting away for a 9:25 flight while everyone else fell out early.

There were some great flights in tough conditions. In the last round Lenny and Skip stared at each other trying to see who was going to launch first. Looking at the guys already in the air, neither was in any hurry to go. Skip finally saw a pilot with some buoyancy and launched milking out a 4+ minute round. Lenny held off and eventually launched getting a 1:59 with a good landing. While there was plenty of time for a relight, Lenny never saw anything worth relighting in and eventually let the clock run out and kept his 1:59 score. Skips 4 minute score won the round.

I had a couple of excellent flights where I got down to 50 feet or so and then managed to save the flight and get away for my times. Personally it was the best contest I have ever flown.

The F3J format is one of the most fun contest formats, there is the simultaneous launch and landings along with a lot of strategy for the optional relight. In challenging air - the strategy can make the difference! Come on out for the next one, Don Ingram will be running F3J again in April.

We set up 3 winches and allowed pilots to launch at will within the window. In the second or third round Ken Jochim damaged his plane and Rich O'Connell, who came all the way from the springs to attend, experienced radio trouble. That killed 2 of the teams leaving Joseph Newcomb and Cody Remington as the only intact team. We basically flew for fun the rest of the day and wound up with some great conditions later in the afternoon, where Joseph was whining about not being able to do very good rolling circles... Instead of scoring we did pilots choice and awarded Cody Remington the High overall and High amateur awards. As the last standing team, Joseph and Cody won the team event! Hopefully next year we can have some better attendance. There are no scores recorded for this event!

ROCKY MOUNTAIN SOARING ASSOCIATION FIELD RULES

- 1. The sod farm operations take precedence over **ALL** activities. We use the field at the convenience of the owner.
- 2. All members will follow **ALL** instructions from **ANY** sod farm personnel without question.
- 3. When sod farm operations are occurring during a flying session it is **OUR** responsibility to ensure that we will not interfere with operations. If it is unclear as to what is happening or where they intend to mow or work try to talk to workers or management and always move equipment or vacate the premises if necessary. Some workers do not speak very good English in that case you must make every effort to avoid conflict or interference with operations.
- 4. Park only in the designated parking areas Do not park on grass, dirt or roads.
- 5. Avoid setting up on newly seeded areas or young grassy areas. The nice grassy areas are better to land on anyway!
- 6. Establish a frequency control pole and tag system! Frequency control is to be in effect at all times!! All members will post their frequency control tags on the pole and if there are conflicts, please exercise safety sense as well as share the flight time.
- 7. Parking and pit areas should be as condensed as possible for the safety of launch and landing.
- 8. Establish flight line areas for winch launch, high start launch, and hand launch that are separate for the sake of launch, flight & landing safety.
- 9. Flying over the parking/pit areas at less than 30 feet is prohibited. Doing so in competition WILL result in a zero flight score and during R/R flying a disciplinary action by the club.
- 10. No aerobatics or speed runs over the parking/pit/Launch/Landing zones.
- 11. Do not launch if a plane is circling in a launch zone: vacate the launch zone as soon as possible if someone is waiting to launch.
- 12. When entering a thermal occupied by other aircraft, enter in the same direction as the first aircraft
- 13. Landing aircraft have the right of way!
- 14. In the event of no mechanical retriever, please shag your own chute/line for the flight
- 15. Please share the usage of club equipment so that all have equal flight time.
- 16. Please be courteous and helpful to your fellow flyers as well as informative to all guests/spectators. Enjoy yourself and others!!
- 17. Absolutely no debris or trash is to be left on the field! Please take it home with you for disposal.
- 18. Make sure that your plane and electronics are airworthy before each flight. Exercise good safety sense in your flight
- 19. The aircraft will have an identification name/address or AMA number on or in the model in case of loss.
- 20. You MUST tag your winch/high start spikes or stakes with fluorescent tape so they are easily spotted on the field by all concerned. Members may be fined \$10 for each stake or nail not so marked. Previous damage to sod farm equipment from spikes left in the ground have made this rule EXTREMELY important.
- 21. Absolutely no alcoholic beverages will be consumed, prior to or during participation in any model event on the flying field.
