Second club item is a reminder to everyone that we are flying on the West field. If this happens folks will be able to reach the houses very easily. I encourage all members to avoid flying over the housing development whenever possible. You never know what will happen and we want to avoid a miss-hap over a residential neighborhood.

The contest fees for open contests have been finalized at \$10 for Masters with no change for Novice and Sportsman, and \$5 for Hand Launch events. For combo club events where we have more than one, class participants can enter any additional class entry fee will be \$5. Thanks again for everyone's great input on this important subject. We still have very cost effective entry fees when you compare to other flying events hosted.

On the contest front I want to remind everyone that Combo events (see the contest calendar) are a great event for beginners and novices to attend, but if you are a novice please don't hesitate to attend the F3J with winches format events. You will get great support from the senior flyers; you are scored against like level competitors, and there are couple of simple changes (Launch late and land early) you can make to take the pressure off the mass launch and land format.

Finally the Mentor Day season will kick off June 16th. Dr. Dan is hosting, and I would ask for senior members to come out and support Dr. Dan.

That's it for this month. I hope this message finds everyone truly able to enjoy the local soaring conditions, and I wish all your families the best!

F3B in the Rockies Report Jim Monaco

It was a fantastic weekend. We could not have asked for better weather or conditions. The event ran flawlessly with Hal and Sue Remington handling the scoring and Steve Suntken running the flight line.

Everybody pitched in to get things set up and put away. Cathy Monaco catered excellent lunches both days with superb BBQ sandwiches on Saturday and cold meat sandwiches on Sunday. MANY thanks to all that helped out to make this event so successful. I had great feedback from everyone that this was one of the best run events they have attended!

Saturday was a bit breezy with huge sink cycles. The wind stayed consistent the whole day and we never had to move. We got in 6 rounds and there was plenty of carnage. Skip Miller and Bob Lewan were at the top of the leader board after the 6 rounds without taking any significant hits. Cody Remington struggled through a tough day with a mid-air and then a land out into an irrigation canal filled with deep water. His brother jumped into the canal and swam out to retrieve the plane which was being swept away. He owes his brother big time!!! Even after that Cody was still in the top 5... Buzz Averill from Albuquerque (flying off of winches) and Joseph Newcomb rounded out the top 5 going into the second day.

On Sunday the conditions were much better. Light breezes and plenty of lift. Pretty much everyone was getting their times - so the landings became very important. As a result, the same guys that were in the lead at the end of the day on Saturday, managed to hold on to their positions through the rest of the preliminary rounds on Sunday. We got in 10 preliminary rounds total. At 2:30 we began the fl-off with Skip, Bob, Joseph, Cody and Buzz. The first three rounds were uneventful with everyone getting their times. This meant that time on line and landings was crucial. Cody and Joseph were really pushing the clock and had some good scores in the bag. For the fourth and last round everyone knew that just a few seconds separated everyone so short tows were in order for everyone. The bad news was that the air turned to crap.... Joseph ran downwind after something that he felt blow through and made a long trek and never got it and wound up short on time and landed out. Bob Lewan hit the smeg and had to relight. Cody, Skip and Buzz kept working several small bubbles jumping around as they petered out until they finally kicked and they got away in the last 5 minutes of the 15. Now the landings were crucial. The wind direction was swirling around making it hard to pick a landing direction - everyone was making last minute adjustments. For a few seconds it looked like it might be landings over the safety area so the helpers were putting the backup planes on their wingtips to ensure they did not approach under the 3m safety zone, but it finally shifted to the west and everyone had a decent approach.

When the final tally was done Cody edged out Skip for first place by just under 5 points. His margin of victory was completely due to his quick launches and great landing timing with perfect 100 landings. Cody had 9:55+ on 3 of his four finals flights.

F5B in the Rockies Contest June 23/24 CD Lenny Keer

Saturday June 23rd and Sunday June 24th will be the dates for an F5B contest at the sod farm. We'll have entries from several states, possibly including the current US team members. Anybody with a hot liner type electric sailplane is invited to participate and beginners are certainly welcome!

For those who aren't familiar with the F5B format, this is the FAI class of electric sailplane competition flown world-wide. The event begins with the distance task in which the pilot must fly as many laps as possible in 200 seconds. Two markers on the field 150 meters apart dictate the distance course. The motor is used to climb to altitude before entering the course, and then the laps are flown while gliding. The action is fast and exciting! Once the 200 second distance time has ended, the pilot climbs to altitude for the 10-minute thermal duration task, followed by a spot landing.

This is the year for the F5B team selections in the US, so this contest will be a good warm-up for that. The 2008 World Champs will be held in the Ukraine and the USA may be hosting the event in 2010.

I'm hoping to enlist a couple of volunteers to help with signaling turns for the distance task. Anyone interested in helping out either Saturday or Sunday, please let me know.

ROCKY MOUNTAIN SOARING ASSOCIATION FIELD RULES

1. The sod farm operations take precedence over **ALL** activities. We use the field at the convenience of the owner.
2. All members will follow **ALL** instructions from **ANY** sod farm personnel without question.
3. When sod farm operations are occurring during a flying session it is **OUR** responsibility to ensure that we will not interfere with operations. If it is unclear as to what is happening or where they intend to mow or work try to talk to workers or management and always move equipment or vacate the premises if necessary. Some workers do not speak very good English – in that case you must make every effort to avoid conflict or interference with operations.
4. Park only in the designated parking areas Do not park on grass, dirt or roads.
5. Avoid setting up on newly seeded areas or young grassy areas. The nice grassy areas are better to land on anyway!
6. Establish a frequency control pole and tag system! Frequency control is to be in effect at all times!! All members will post their frequency control tags on the pole and if there are conflicts, please exercise safety sense as well as share the flight time.
7. Parking and pit areas should be as condensed as possible for the safety of launch and landing.
8. Establish flight line areas for winch launch, high start launch, and hand launch that are separate for the sake of launch, flight & landing safety.
9. Flying over the parking/pit areas at less than 30 feet is prohibited. Doing so in competition **WILL** result in a zero flight score and during R/R flying a disciplinary action by the club.
10. No aerobatics or speed runs over the parking/pit/Launch/Landing zones.
11. Do not launch if a plane is circling in a launch zone: vacate the launch zone as soon as possible if someone is waiting to launch.
12. When entering a thermal occupied by other aircraft, enter in the same direction as the first aircraft
13. Landing aircraft have the right of way!
14. In the event of no mechanical retriever, please shag your own chute/line for the flight
15. Please share the usage of club equipment so that all have equal flight time.
16. Please be courteous and helpful to your fellow flyers as well as informative to all guests/spectators. Enjoy yourself and others!!
17. Absolutely no debris or trash is to be left on the field! Please take it home with you for disposal.
18. Make sure that your plane and electronics are airworthy before each flight. Exercise good safety sense in your flight
19. The aircraft will have an identification name/address or AMA number on or in the model in case of loss.
20. You **MUST** tag your winch/high start spikes or stakes with fluorescent tape so they are easily spotted on the field by all concerned. Members may be fined \$10 for each stake or nail not so marked. Previous damage to sod farm equipment from spikes left in the ground have made this rule **EXTREMELY** important.
21. Absolutely no alcoholic beverages will be consumed, prior to or during participation in any model event on the flying field.

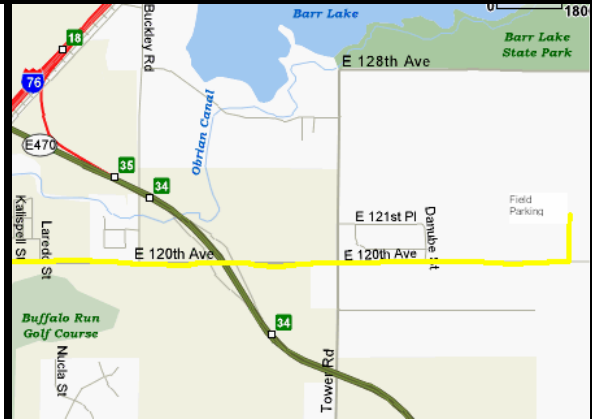

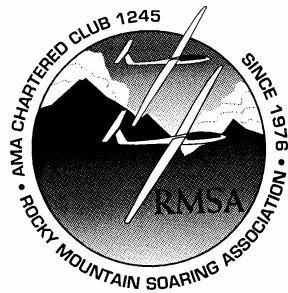
