The second HLG contest of the season was held on a pleasant July day with warm temps and plenty of Colorado sunshine. We had 9 pilots even though we were missing several of the regulars. John Ihlein was in town on business and was joined by Aradhana (or ASK, his initials from the web where he provides numerous building tips). Aradhana is the man behind the Blue Skies HLG contest series as well as the producer of the LightHawk DLG and creator of the RC Builder web project. Definitely an interesting guy! He is interested in adding a Colorado 2 day DLG contest to the Blue Sky series. What do you think?

Our guests, as well as Steve Suntken, were flying LightHawks with Aradhana sporting a narrow chord version that launched impressively and seemed to have good legs returning from downwind. Unfortunately, we had an odd number of pilots and no extra helpers so we had to have one timer work with 2 pilots in one flight group. After round 1, Jim Monaco flew for fun without a timer, as he had to leave early. We'll get you flying more next time Jim!

The day had abundant thermals that became quick moving with the afternoon breezes. It was a challenge to see how far these could be followed before returning. There were many off field landings. John Ihlein had a fuselage failure in round 4 and couldn't continue. I suffered a wing bolt failure on launch in the last round. You've got to remember to change those plastic bolts at least once a year!

Cody showed the best judgment working the downwind lift and emerged victorious with Aradhana just one off field landing behind.

Like everyone else I took a hit, and mine was in round 4. Round 2 was quite interesting in that I managed to get away and was pounding everyone in the group. I knew I had the round in the bag as everyone had relaunched, and I had more time than they could get. Unfortunately Charlie had forgotten to restart the watch for Bob Lewan's relaunch and therefore did not have a good time. As CD I was asked to rule if Bob should get a reflight because of a timing failure. I had to recuse myself as I had a vested interest in the outcome. We then asked Skip's opinion and he indicated that failure to time a flight is cause for reflight. So the group was reflown and Bob won the reflight avoiding the big hit. We all wanted to get 6 rounds in so we could have a throw out, but that was not to be. Rain was moving in and we had all we could do to hustle and get the winches put away. Just as we finished cleaning up we got a downpour. We waited that out, and then did the awards. Bob Lewan bested all comers winning all but one of his groups. I was second and Phil Jones did a great job and wound up in third.

It was a great contest and terrific practice for the Nats. I hope more people make it out for the next event...

ROCKY MOUNTAIN SOARING ASSOCIATION FIELD RULES

- The sod farm operations take precedence over ALL activities. We use the field at the convenience of 1. the owner.
- All members will follow ALL instructions from ANY sod farm personnel without question. 2.
- 3. When sod farm operations are occurring during a flying session it is **OUR** responsibility to ensure that we will not interfere with operations. If it is unclear as to what is happening or where they intend to mow or work try to talk to workers or management and always move equipment or vacate the premises if necessary. Some workers do not speak very good English – in that case you must make every effort to avoid conflict or interference with operations.
- Park only in the designated parking areas Do not park on grass, dirt or roads. 4.
- Avoid setting up on newly seeded areas or young grassy areas. The nice grassy areas are better to land 5. on anyway!
- Establish a frequency control pole and tag system! Frequency control is to be in effect at all times!! All 6. members will post their frequency control tags on the pole and if there are conflicts, please exercise safety sense as well as share the flight time.
- Parking and pit areas should be as condensed as possible for the safety of launch and landing. 7.
- Establish flight line areas for winch launch, high start launch, and hand launch that are separate for the 8. sake of launch, flight & landing safety.
- 9. Flying over the parking/pit areas at less than 30 feet is prohibited. Doing so in competition WILL result in a zero flight score and during R/R flying a disciplinary action by the club.
- 10. No aerobatics or speed runs over the parking/pit/Launch/Landing zones.
- Do not launch if a plane is circling in a launch zone: vacate the launch zone as soon as possible if 11. someone is waiting to launch.
- 12. When entering a thermal occupied by other aircraft, enter in the same direction as the first aircraft
- 13. Landing aircraft have the right of way!
- 14. In the event of no mechanical retriever, please shag your own chute/line for the flight
- 15. Please share the usage of club equipment so that all have equal flight time.
- 16. Please be courteous and helpful to your fellow flyers as well as informative to all guests/spectators. Enjoy yourself and others!!
- 17. Absolutely no debris or trash is to be left on the field! Please take it home with you for disposal.
- 18. Make sure that your plane and electronics are airworthy before each flight. Exercise good safety sense in your flight
- 19. The aircraft will have an identification name/address or AMA number on or in the model in case of loss.
- You MUST tag your winch/high start spikes or stakes with fluorescent tape so they are easily spotted on 20. the field by all concerned. Members may be fined \$10 for each stake or nail not so marked. Previous

	damage to sod farm equipment from spikes left in the ground have made this rule EXTREME important.	
21.	Absolutely no alcoholic beverages will be consumed, prior to or during participation in any model even on the flying field.	vent


