#### Potpourri

#### WINCH MOTORS -Bob Vixie

The winch that I bought from Dave Meyers here in the Springs had a 12v starter motor on it. It also had a funky wire brake on it. It's the one I brought down to Phoenix several years ago and tried to set up for the F3J practice. That must have been 2006. I've since replaced the brake with a nice one, which works very well.

Anyway, the 12v motor just wasn't getting it done... So last week I did a web search looking for the 6v version. I found the dog lure guy, who now has motors with ball bearings built in and a different bolt pattern, but he want's like \$300 for the motor. I already have a set of Real Balls, so I wasn't interested in that.

I then ran a cross a couple of places selling new motors that had a different part number but claimed they were a replacement for the motor I was looking for. They wanted \$100 + 13 shipping. So I ordered one.

Two days later it was on my porch... drop shipped out of Denver. Opened it up, and it was perfect. Saturday morning I took my winch apart and put the new motor in. I had to do was shorten the spacer by about a 16th of an inch and fill off some posts that touched the Real Balls brush springs.

It seems to have plenty of pull as I put the line back on the drum, but I haven't had a chance to try it out yet. So I don't know if it will get hot or anything under loads.

So if anyone up there or the club is looking for motors, I have a line on some. I don't want to give out the link until I've had a chance to try it out, but that should be in a week or two. **Bob Vixie**

The Sailplane is white with the underside of the wings teal green. The **Eraser** and **Eraser Xtreme** are pure F3J or thermal duration (TD) glider. These designs have proven over the years that they are highly competitive and the faithfulness of the pilots to this design shows that other designs don't fulfill their requirement as well. So it remains a well balanced design using state of the art technology, yet completely hand made process.



Hollow core molded wings with special bottom hinged flaps (for full 90 deg. down flaps) leads to stable approach and accurate landings. The MH-32 Airfoil has a very wide speed range; its full potential can be obtained when using full flap control over the different flight configuration: a couple of degrees down in thermal turns, a degree reflex in transition. Small changes in camber have substantial changes in behavior, which help outperform other standard designs. The whole model is built strong yet light achieving an average weight of around 2-2.2 kg.




	The sod farm operations take precedence over ALL activities. We use the field at the convenience of the

	All members will follow <b>ALL</b> instructions from <b>ANY</b> sod farm personnel without question.
•11	When sod farm operations are occurring during a flying session it is <b>OUR</b> responsibility to ensure that we
