Field Manager's Message-----Steve Suntken

Well.. Even though it see just a little odd talking about flying as I look out the window and see about two feet of snow and 30° temps, I did get a chance to fly, along with Jon Lovins, in the newly suggested area few couple weeks ago. Both he and I came to the conclusion that this just isn't the best of places. For one, the large sod pile "Does" disturb the ground air at various times. It's not that one cannot control a plane when the air becomes unstable, it's more like "Why should I have to?" And two; even though it didn't show up yet, I could see this area becoming quite dusty when the winds REALLY decided to kick-in. And on a third note, I took another real hard look at this area and noticed, because of the new parking restrictions (meaning.- stay off the oats around the perimeter). That this would mean having to park approximately 40' from the grass. Plus, within that 40' distance one would have to deal with uneven, bumpy ground. Filled with what else??..Goat Heads!!! NO WAY!! So it was decided that the flying area will remain where it is. The sod farm crew is behind in their schedule and the grass has not be harvested to the frequency flag, yet. But it will be. If & when this happens, we will just jog a tad to the North and fly pretty much where we've set up for our last comp. Please remember to park "behind" the frequency flag.

Also...Jon and I were talking about fixing up the winch trailer doors and thought it would be easier if we could come across a pair of mobile home type doors. Which is basically what's on there now. Rather than trying to rebuild what's there now and keep these things at a decent weight. So...EVERYONE..keep your eyes & ears alert to any where we might pick up a pair. Preferably with the frames.
