# President's Message Bruce Martin

Soaring season is quickly getting into full swing with Colorado conditions getting better all of the time. The last F3J contest presented some very challenging conditions. It was very interesting to see on a cold and complete cloud cover day the amount of thermal activity that was present. Was very challenging for the pilots. You could not just launch high and fly at min sink. You really had to recognize the lift and go with hard when you found it. Of course that is typical Colorado soaring.

Mike Verzuh sent out an email about launching for F3J that made some valid points. When we are all launching that close together the planes need to be trimmed right. I would recommend on any contest that we are using mass launch the C/D should allow a small window for any contestant to get a trim flight in. We would rather have the plane ready before you get there but that is not always possible. Even with a trimmed plane sometimes bad launches happen. We just need to minimize it as much as possible. We all have too much money in these planes. If at the start of a contest you need a trim flight ask for it. No one will fault you for wanting a trim flight. The plane you might save is ours.

Most of you have seen the email thread and heard the discussions at the last contest about the F3J scoring issues. From what we have uncovered I see two primary options. The first one is we leave everything as is. This would also allow the C/D of any F3J contest assign trophies by the finals, but season points only count for preliminaries. If we do this I also would recommend we change the scoring for F3J in the Rockies and any national contest that has a finals to the same thing. The scoring algorithm that was proposed to use in the past has some flaws. One possibility if we stay with the status quo is for contests that have a finals with at least 3 rounds we could also count as two separate contests and you pick which score you want to use. The second option is to assign bonus points to the finals for F3J. Those points are added to your score for how well you placed in the finals. To do this fairly we would have to assign the same bonus points to all contests weather there was a final or not. There are lots of ramifications to this option and I am open to the club's wishes. Cody's original reason for wanting the change was to have finals that have meaning and allow people to fly the prelims conservatively like a real F3J contest. I am not convinced that learning to fly conservatively in the prelims is the best course for us. Our goal should be to get as many pilots as possible into the team select finals. To make the finals at team selects you are going to have to fly the prelims fairly aggressive. It is easy to practice laying off. I would rather have our pilots used to the flying every round like it mattered. Think about it, sleep on it and send me your thoughts.

One of our clubs best kept secrets is we have awesome practice area out at Cherryvale open space. Several people can usually be found practicing there at lunch time during the week. The site is a great place to work on reading thermals and decision making. We do great death matches out there that really hone your skills. If you are open at lunch time and can carry a charged plane come out and join us. It is some of the best practice you will get. Call myself, Mike Verzuh or Jim Monaco if you need more info.

I still have Vista ridge academy available for indoor flying for people that want to. I also might be able to get into Erie middle school gym as well. Let me know if you are interested. Everyone continue to invite people out to the field to fly. I would really like to see some more new blood come into the club.

Keep practicing and getting ready for F3J in the Rockies and then team selects. This is going to be a fun season.



# PIKE SUPERIOR, PIKE SUPERIOR S/L (super light), and SCHPOTDORKER. \$400(obo) each, or \$1,000(obo) for all three.

Definitely used, but all of these F3J gliders are in great flying condition. All three have been repaired.

The Pike Superior has an easy to fix crack in the fuselage. Great flying plane that has a ballast tube and sturdy wing. White on the top with Stars and Stripes design.

Pike Superior S/L (super light), has no ballast tube, and climbs very well in the lightest lift. It is orange, with an unmatched blue wingtip that was replaced.

The Schpotdorker (bagged wing) is the master of light winds, light lift and precision "Schpot" landings. Wingspar on one wing was repaired/reinforced.

All three planes include the receiver, 1500ma battery, and servos. All three were flown April of this year and they fly perfectly. If you need a fleet of gliders to get started in F3J, and don't want to risk big bucks while learning the ropes, then this might be the answer.



#### ROCKY MOUNTAIN SOARING ASSOCIATION FIELD RULES

The sod farm operations take precedence over **ALL** activities. We use the field at the convenience of the owner.

All members will follow ALL instructions from ANY sod farm personnel without question.

When sod farm operations are occurring during a flying session it is **OUR** responsibility to ensure that we will not interfere with operations. If it is unclear as to what is happening or where they intend to mow or work try to talk to workers or management and always move equipment or vacate the premises if necessary. Some workers do not speak very good English – in that case you must make every effort to avoid conflict or interference with operations.

Park only in the designated parking areas Do not park on grass, dirt or roads.

Avoid setting up on newly seeded areas or young grassy areas. The nice grassy areas are better to land on anyway!

Establish a frequency control pole and tag system! Frequency control is to be in effect at all times!! All members will post their frequency control tags on the pole and if there are conflicts, please exercise safety sense as well as share the flight time.

Parking and pit areas should be as condensed as possible for the safety of launch and landing.

Establish flight line areas for winch launch, high start launch, and hand launch that are separate for the sake of launch, flight & landing safety.

Flying over the parking/pit areas at less than 30 feet is prohibited. Doing so in competition WILL result in a zero flight score and during R/R flying a disciplinary action by the club.

No aerobatics or speed runs over the parking/pit/Launch/Landing zones.

Do not launch if a plane is circling in a launch zone: vacate the launch zone as soon as possible if someone is waiting to launch.

When entering a thermal occupied by other aircraft, enter in the same direction as the first aircraft Landing aircraft have the right of way!

In the event of no mechanical retriever, please shag your own chute/line for the flight

Please share the usage of club equipment so that all have equal flight time.

Please be courteous and helpful to your fellow flyers as well as informative to all guests/spectators. Enjoy yourself and others!!

Absolutely no debris or trash is to be left on the field! Please take it home with you for disposal.

Make sure that your plane and electronics are airworthy before each flight. Exercise good safety sense in your flight

The aircraft will have an identification name/address or AMA number on or in the model in case of loss.

You MUST tag your winch/high start spikes or stakes with fluorescent tape so they are easily spotted on the field by all concerned. Members may be fined \$10 for each stake or nail not so marked. Previous damage to sod farm equipment from spikes left in the ground have made this rule EXTREMELY important.

Absolutely no alcoholic beverages will be consumed, prior to or during participation in any model event on the flying field.
