F3J in the ROCKIES RESULTS CD Cody Remington

For those of you who did not make it to F3J in the Rockies it was again a very successful contest, and once again showed that RMSA is the premier F3J club in the US. After much deliberation about fly offs, Jim Monaco was kind enough to allow me to take over organizing F3J in the Rockies. This was the first year that F3J in the Rockies was going to be all winches, and there was some concern about organizing the fly offs, and how everyone would get equipment. However everything ran very smoothly. I allowed the exact number of pilots in the fly offs as there were teams also allocating one club winch for every pilot. This worked very well and everyone stuck around for the fly offs kindly letting the pilots in need. This format works very good, and there is no reason we should change it in the upcoming years.

The conditions this year were some of the best we have seen in the past 3 years. There was a little breeze, and variable lift conditions from big air to big sink to dead air. It was very challenging at time. RMSA's members again flew very well and filled up 5 out of the 6 fly off positions with RMSA finishing 1st, 3rd, 4th, 5th, and 6th. The condition in the fly offs were challenging. The wind had picked up and made it so the pilots needed 2-3 thermals at a minimum to get the full time. This proved to be extremely challenging, and only 2 of the pilots made all their flight time.

There was plenty of support for the contest because of the help of Tom Tate, Jim Smith, and my parents. Because of their help the contest ran very smoothly. Also Jim Monaco was a huge help with the scoring system, and some behind the scene work. The next time you see them please say thanks.

The May DLG contest was held at the Jonke DLG Ranch... and I've gotta say that it's a wonderful place to fly. John has spent a lot of time expanding the flying field on his property, and it easily accommodated us. The views were amazing, and the flying was even better.

After getting a weather-related postponement and some nervousness about the conditions as we approached the new date, we were glad to finally see a beautiful day for flying. Ten pilots joined up for a day of competition. Once again, I was amazed by how conditions can be so different within such a short distance. In the first couple rounds, you were either in good lift, or terrible sink... and once you were in the grips of one, getting to the other seemed nearly impossible. Some of the other rounds became subject to what I'll call the "DLG Ranch Syndrome" – a condition where the sky is either total lift or total sink. Those rounds had some of the most amazing lift I've ever seen, with several planes getting quickly sucked up to speck height. The down-side is that if your round was during the sink cycle, getting a 1-minute flight became a challenge.

Lunch was provided by the Jonkes on the deck of their home. Great conversation with great food and a great group of guys (and a few of the wives, too)! The Jonkes will be hosting another contest at the Ranch again soon – probably the September contest. If you decide to join us for that one, you won't be disappointed.

As for the contest results, it appears that youth, in the form of Scott Dueck, triumphed over maturity... but we gave it all we had, and had a great time trying.

ROCKY MOUNTAIN SOARING ASSOCIATION FIELD RULES

- 1. The sod farm operations take precedence over **ALL** activities. We use the field at the convenience of the owner.
- 2. All members will follow **ALL** instructions from **ANY** sod farm personnel without question.
- 3. When sod farm operations are occurring during a flying session it is **OUR** responsibility to ensure that we will not interfere with operations. If it is unclear as to what is happening or where they intend to mow or work try to talk to workers or management and always move equipment or vacate the premises if necessary. Some workers do not speak very good English in that case you must make every effort to avoid conflict or interference with operations.
- 4. Park only in the designated parking areas Do not park on grass, dirt or roads.
- 5. Avoid setting up on newly seeded areas or young grassy areas. The nice grassy areas are better to land on anyway!
- 6. Establish a frequency control pole and tag system! Frequency control is to be in effect at all times!! All members will post their frequency control tags on the pole and if there are conflicts, please exercise safety sense as well as share the flight time.
- 7. Parking and pit areas should be as condensed as possible for the safety of launch and landing.
- 8. Establish flight line areas for winch launch, high start launch, and hand launch that are separate for the sake of launch, flight & landing safety.
- 9. Flying over the parking/pit areas at less than 30 feet is prohibited. Doing so in competition WILL result in a zero flight score and during R/R flying a disciplinary action by the club.
- 10. No aerobatics or speed runs over the parking/pit/Launch/Landing zones.
- 11. Do not launch if a plane is circling in a launch zone: vacate the launch zone as soon as possible if someone is waiting to launch.
- 12. When entering a thermal occupied by other aircraft, enter in the same direction as the first aircraft
- 13. Landing aircraft have the right of way!
- 14. In the event of no mechanical retriever, please shag your own chute/line for the flight
- 15. Please share the usage of club equipment so that all have equal flight time.
- 16. Please be courteous and helpful to your fellow flyers as well as informative to all guests/spectators. Enjoy yourself and others!!
- 17. Absolutely no debris or trash is to be left on the field! Please take it home with you for disposal.
- 18. Make sure that your plane and electronics are airworthy before each flight. Exercise good safety sense in your flight
- 19. The aircraft will have an identification name/address or AMA number on or in the model in case of loss.
- 20. You MUST tag your winch/high start spikes or stakes with fluorescent tape so they are easily spotted on the field by all concerned. Members may be fined \$10 for each stake or nail not so marked. Previous damage to sod farm equipment from spikes left in the ground has made this rule EXTREMELY important.
- 21. Absolutely no alcoholic beverages will be consumed, prior to or during participation in any model event on the flying field.
