President's Message		Jim Monaco

It has been a busy summer for the RMSA guys – we continue to demonstrate that the RMSA pilots are some of the best in the country. Recently 6 pilots went to the Soaring Nationals in Muncie and we did very well. In open class RMSA had 4 of the top 5 places with Cody continuing his dominance flying a new to him Egida. Mike Verzuh and Skip Miller took 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place, with Jon Padilla grabbing 5<sup>th</sup> place. In F3J three of the top six places were RMSA guys. Cody took the top spot with some great flying. I managed to fly my best event ever and wound up in 3<sup>rd</sup> place and Jon Padilla rounded out the top 6 in 6<sup>th</sup> place. The rest of this column I will describe my experience at the Nats...

My goal was top 10 finishes in Open and F3J. The weather for Open class was awesome – temps in the 80s and relatively low humidity and light breezes. There was generally plenty of lift around as long as you did not do anything stupid. The big trouble spot was the landing zone. For "safety" reasons the contest organizers set up the landing tapes at least 30 feet from the safety line. This is way further than any event I have ever attended and it really added a level of luck to the landings. Depth perception at that distance is quite unreliable, so there were a lot of short and long landings. I started out strong, when usually the first flight in the morning is one of my weakest. The second round I had a communication issue with my timer, and wound up barely making it back to the field. They had a small field boundary marked out and any landing out of the cones resulted in a zero flight score. I was barely inside the cones when I got back. With no throw outs, this put a real kink in my place in the standings. I managed to get all the rest of my times with decent landings and kept moving up the standings every round. After the final round I had moved up to 14<sup>th</sup> place and was actually quite happy with my performance. I was ready to get started in F3J.

I spent the evening getting the field set up for F3J in the morning. In the morning I was busy getting the logistics of the event set up and the scorekeeper set up and left the set up of our equipment to Jon and Blayne. We struggled a bit getting set up and were very glad we had a bye in the first group. When we did get started, I tanked the first flight... Six minutes does not cut it with the level of competition that was on the field. So this was my throw out – no more mistakes were allowed. Now it was VERY hot in Muncie and the CD allowed us to set up tents and shades on the flight line. The lift was about, but so was the sink. You needed to make good decisions and not get off on your own without a solid read. The rest of the contest I flew very well. My new glasses were allowing me to fly further than I normally do and with light winds I could fly my light Icon 2 with a white center section and orange tips that gives me great visibility. Most of the flights were uneventful, but there were 2 where my callers really saved my butt. Jon and Blayne were great giving me all the info I needed and thinking one step ahead for "plan B". The last flight of the event I was solidly in the top 5 and just needed a decent flight to stay there. My callers put me in good air and I skied out, just flying around under a cloud so I could see it. One good approach and landing and I was in... I was a bit early but nailed the 100 and was stoked. I high fived my callers and waited for the results. I was very pleased to see that I wound up in 3<sup>rd</sup> place – my best finish ever in a major event!

It is clear I still have some things to work on – especially shorter launches and giving away less time on the landings. This is certainly a confidence booster and I am excited to attend the F3J Team Selections.

On a related note – the RMSA 7 are attending the Team Selections is Florida at the end of October. Bob Pederson has volunteered to drive the trailer down and back – we thank him VERY much, it will be so much better for us with all of our stuff there. We will be practicing hard, hoping to put 3 RMSA members on the US Team... Wish us luck – Jim

# **ROCKY MOUNTAIN SOARING ASSOCIATION FIELD RULES**

- The sod farm operations take precedence over ALL activities. We use the field at the convenience of the owner.
   All members will follow ALL instructions from ANY sod farm personnel without question.
   When sod farm operations are occurring during a flying session it is OUR responsibility to ensure that we
- 3. When sod farm operations are occurring during a flying session it is **OUR** responsibility to ensure that we will not interfere with operations. If it is unclear as to what is happening or where they intend to mow or work try to talk to workers or management and always move equipment or vacate the premises if necessary. Some workers do not speak very good English in that case you must make every effort to avoid conflict or interference with operations.
- 4. Park only in the designated parking areas Do not park on grass, dirt or roads.
- 5. Avoid setting up on newly seeded areas or young grassy areas. The nice grassy areas are better to land on anyway!
- 6. Establish a frequency control pole and tag system! Frequency control is to be in effect at all times!! All members will post their frequency control tags on the pole and if there are conflicts, please exercise safety sense as well as share the flight time.
- 7. Parking and pit areas should be as condensed as possible for the safety of launch and landing.
- 8. Establish flight line areas for winch launch, high start launch, and hand launch that are separate for the sake of launch, flight & landing safety.
- 9. Flying over the parking/pit areas at less than 30 feet is prohibited. Doing so in competition WILL result in a zero flight score and during R/R flying a disciplinary action by the club.
- 10. No aerobatics or speed runs over the parking/pit/Launch/Landing zones.
- 11. Do not launch if a plane is circling in a launch zone: vacate the launch zone as soon as possible if someone is waiting to launch.
- 12. When entering a thermal occupied by other aircraft, enter in the same direction as the first aircraft
- 13. Landing aircraft have the right of way!
- 14. In the event of no mechanical retriever, please shag your own chute/line for the flight
- 15. Please share the usage of club equipment so that all have equal flight time.
- 16. Please be courteous and helpful to your fellow flyers as well as informative to all guests/spectators. Enjoy yourself and others!!
- 17. Absolutely no debris or trash is to be left on the field! Please take it home with you for disposal.
- 18. Make sure that your plane and electronics are airworthy before each flight. Exercise good safety sense in your flight
- 19. The aircraft will have an identification name/address or AMA number on or in the model in case of loss.
- 20. You MUST tag your winch/high start spikes or stakes with fluorescent tape so they are easily spotted on the field by all concerned. Members may be fined \$10 for each stake or nail not so marked. Previous damage to sod farm equipment from spikes left in the ground has made this rule EXTREMELY important.
- 21. Absolutely no alcoholic beverages will be consumed, prior to or during participation in any model event on the flying field.
