MARCH Open Contest Report

What a difference a week makes... This contest was postponed from the previous Sunday due to 40mph winds – and the new date turned out beautifully. The prediction was for light winds and near 80 degree temperatures, alas this is Colorado and that was not exactly right... The day dawned with a pretty good overcast and chilly temps. This was still fabulous for March – but no where near 80. The morning air was very flat and required really smooth control inputs and far flying. The Masters guys mostly got their times for the first 3 rounds, and the Sportsman had their challenges as you would expect. Corey and Jim Rogers were working on their trims a bit during these flights and that affected their scores. We took a lunch break after 5 rounds and decided to fly 2 more. The air looked pretty good and someone said the rest of the fights should be easy... NEVER say that in Colorado. Round 6 was pretty easy with most of the pilots getting their times, but the Round 7 was a different story. The wind shifted around to a hard 90 degree cross. I popped off when the plan came out of my hand poorly in the crosswind – so we brought the group down and started over. No more "do-overs" left so I had to make this launch work. It still launched erratic, but I managed a full launch. Blayne immediately ran downwind, and I thought that was a poor strategy, so I decided to head north and then cross the wind and look for the bump. And look... and look with nary a sign of lift. 3 of the 4 pilots were down in 3 ½ minutes. Blayne managed to make the downwind run work for just over 6 minutes and clobbered the rest of us.

Blayne and Mike were flying great all contest. Mike won 6 of his 7 rounds and Blayne won 5. The difference was when Blayne was flying against Mike and hit a perfect 10:00 and 100 landing. This gave him the 1.5 points he needed to edge out Mike for the Masters win.

Jim Rogers, Tom Tate and Corey Shantz battled it out for the Sportsman title with Jim Rogers clobbering everyone in his group in round 4 to claim his margin of victory.

Thanks to everyone that came out and had fun – we got a lot of flying in and learned a lot in the process... Jim

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March DLG Contest Report Bob Pederson

This contest was a little different in that we wanted it to be AMA sanctioned and thus be eligible to qualify DLG pilots for the upcoming F3K team select contest. The TS will hopefully be held in Denver this summer and we are trying to get as many pilots qualified to make it competitive. We ended up with 16 pilots which meant that the top 30 % (4 pilots) would get a point toward qualifying for the team select contest.

The flying conditions were challenging to say the least. The weather was mild but the winds kept increasing during the day resulting in launching and surfing upwind of the field. If you went downwind which many brave pilots did, you really had to fight to get back to the field. Some didn't including Cory Shantz who had a long, leisurely walk home from about a half mile away. Sorry Cory; sometimes you're the Hero, sometimes you're the Zero.

We were very lucky to have two out-of-towners drive over from Utah to join us and fly. Jon Lemon and Adrian Dybwad showed up and flew very well. Jon had a new Helios glider that looked like it would be a good challenger for the Concepts and Stobels out there. You might remember that Adrian (Extrem ewing on RC Groups) is the author of F3K Timer which is a Droid phone app for organizing, running and timing DLG contests. We wanted to try out this app with the intention of using it for the Team Selects (assuming we are awarded the bid). There were a few glitches in the software but Adrian took good notes and will be updating the software in advance of our next contest (April 22nd). All in all it was an excellent contest, Thanks Dave Jensen.

The April DLG contest will be on the 22nd and will be held at Bob Pederson's field up in Berthoud Co. I'm about 45 minutes north of Denver and 40 minutes from Boulder. It should provide a different soaring experience, no flat land soaring here. I have a combination of hills and valleys to work with that will create some challenging and fun conditions. I'll be providing lunch so you don't have to bring your own. I'll have water and Gatorade so if you want something else, bring it. Since this is at my house, we'll have bathroom facilities so your wives, spousal units, significant others are invited and will be comfortable. This contest is AMA sanctioned so you will need to bring your AMA card and sign the safety waiver. If you're not an AMA member, you can sign up at the field. Entry fee is \$5.00. The top 30% of pilots at the end of the day will earn one point toward qualifying to fly the F3K team select contest this summer.

Pilots meeting will be at 8:30 with first flight around 9:00. I expect to finish around 3:30. We will fly as many rounds as we can in that time. I intend to do another trial run with Adrian Dybwad's "F3K Timer program. We intend to use this program if we get to host the F3K team selects so we want to get used to its operation. If you have a Droid phone, download Adrian's F3K Timer program and update it just before the 22nd. See this thread on RC Group if you want to learn about the program:

ROCKY MOUNTAIN SOARING ASSOCIATION FIELD RULES

- 1. The sod farm operations take precedence over **ALL** activities. We use the field at the convenience of the owner.
 - All members will follow **ALL** instructions from **ANY** sod farm personnel without question.
- 3. When sod farm operations are occurring during a flying session it is **OUR** responsibility to ensure that we will not interfere with operations. If it is unclear as to what is happening or where they intend to mow or work try to talk to workers or management and always move equipment or vacate the premises if necessary. Some workers do not speak very good English in that case you must make every effort to avoid conflict or interference with operations.
- 4. Park only in the designated parking areas Do not park on grass, dirt or roads.
- 5. Avoid setting up on newly seeded areas or young grassy areas. The nice grassy areas are better to land on anyway!
- 6. Establish a frequency control pole and tag system! Frequency control is to be in effect at all times!! All members will post their frequency control tags on the pole and if there are conflicts, please exercise safety sense as well as share the flight time.
- 7. Parking and pit areas should be as condensed as possible for the safety of launch and landing.
- 8. Establish flight line areas for winch launch, high start launch, and hand launch that are separate for the sake of launch, flight & landing safety.
- 9. Flying over the parking/pit areas at less than 30 feet is prohibited. Doing so in competition WILL result in a zero flight score and during R/R flying a disciplinary action by the club.
- 10. No aerobatics or speed runs over the parking/pit/Launch/Landing zones.
- 11. Do not launch if a plane is circling in a launch zone: vacate the launch zone as soon as possible if someone is waiting to launch.
- 12. When entering a thermal occupied by other aircraft, enter in the same direction as the first aircraft
- 13. Landing aircraft have the right of way!

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- 14. In the event of no mechanical retriever, please shag your own chute/line for the flight
- 15. Please share the usage of club equipment so that all have equal flight time.
- 16. Please be courteous and helpful to your fellow flyers as well as informative to all guests/spectators. Enjoy yourself and others!!
- 17. Absolutely no debris or trash is to be left on the field! Please take it home with you for disposal.
- 18. Make sure that your plane and electronics are airworthy before each flight. Exercise good safety sense in your flight
- 19. The aircraft will have an identification name/address or AMA number on or in the model in case of loss.
- 20. You MUST tag your winch/high start spikes or stakes with fluorescent tape so they are easily spotted on the field by all concerned. Members may be fined \$10 for each stake or nail not so marked. Previous damage to sod farm equipment from spikes left in the ground has made this rule EXTREMELY important.
- 21. Absolutely no alcoholic beverages will be consumed, prior to or during participation in any model event on the flying field.
