

## September Challenge Cup Contest Report

We had a light turnout again for an event but 6 RMSA and 3 PPSS pilots attended for an enjoyable time. Thanks to Bob Avery, Chris Keller and Frank Deis for making it all the way from the springs.

I was there early to get the trailer and get a couple of trim flights in and the PPSS guys showed up. After they got their planes assembled Bob Avery asked me to look at his plane and help with a range test. I was happy to oblige and when he turned the radio on the rudder went hard right. I pointed this out and Bob replied that he just flew it the day before and it was perfect. We tested a few hypothesis out including: a stripped gear that jumped teeth (a bunch) and ruled that out, a bad servo (we could not detect anything wrong), loose linkages – nope... hmm quite a mystery. Bob finally just popped the arm off the servo and re centered it and was good the rest of the day. Any guesses what it might have been – I'll bet you don't get it...

On to the contest. With 9 people we decided that we would run three 3 person flight groups with a PPSS pilot in each one. The air was really fickle with a number of short flight times. No one really got away and it was a struggle for most flights. The PPSS guys were holding their own against the RMSA contingent, and the scores were fairly close finishing out the 5<sup>th</sup> round. At that point I got a phone call from United Airlines – the 6:45PM flight I was scheduled on that nite for business was canceled and I needed to call immediately to get rescheduled. When I called they told me the only flight that I could get on that could get me to my destination before midnight was at 3:00pm – about 1 hour and 10 minutes from then. I had to quickly pull out of the contest and get my stuff packed and off to the airport hoping to catch that flight. Bob A and maybe Brody put my planes away while I rushed to set up the scoring program in the trailer so Mike could enter the scores after I left. I quickly scooted off and the contest continued. As I discovered later my withdrawal caused a bit of a scheduling problem in that the flight group I was in only had 2 pilots, so they decided to run a spoiler in the group and drew numbers out of a hat to see who the spoiler would be. Chris Keller was selected and did his job whooping up on the other 2 pilots! Great Job Chris!!!

Since they were shy a pilot now for even flight groups they decided to call it a contest after the 6<sup>th</sup> round. In the mean time I made it to the airport and to the gate just as they were boarding. Mike called with some scoring questions that I answered as they closed up the doors.

In the end RMSA prevailed again holding on to the Challenge Cup and home field advantage for another year. Mike was the overall winner with Bruce  $2^{nd}$  on the RMSA team and Jim Rogers in  $3^{rd}$ . I managed  $4^{th}$  despite a zero round...

Poor John Lovins had some bad luck when his transmitter came loose from his neck strapp and he dropped it during the launch – and the plane went spiraling before he could pick it up... I donate one of the famous Monaco customized Airtronicsneck strapss with the sliding clip. Mike and I have both had our transmitters come loose

before but with much less trauma so I had modified all my neck straps and one for Mike with a clip that won't come loose.

Brody, our newcomer did well, keeping his plane in one piece and learning a bunch from the competition. It was a really fun and challenging contest and a great day for flying. Too bad you were not there...

#### ROCKY MOUNTAIN SOARING ASSOCIATION FIELD RULES

- The sod farm operations take precedence over **ALL** activities. We use the field at the convenience of the owner. 1. 2.
  - All members will follow **ALL** instructions from **ANY** sod farm personnel without question.
- 3. When sod farm operations are occurring during a flying session it is **OUR** responsibility to ensure that we will not interfere with operations. If it is unclear as to what is happening or where they intend to mow or work try to talk to workers or management and always move equipment or vacate the premises if necessary. Some workers do not speak very good English – in that case you must make every effort to avoid conflict or interference with operations.
  - Park only in the designated parking areas Do not park on grass, dirt or roads.
  - Avoid setting up on newly seeded areas or young grassy areas. The nice grassy areas are better to land on anyway!
- Establish a frequency control pole and tag system! Frequency control is to be in effect at all times!! All 6. members will post their frequency control tags on the pole and if there are conflicts, please exercise safety sense as well as share the flight time.
- 7. Parking and pit areas should be as condensed as possible for the safety of launch and landing.
- Establish flight line areas for winch launch, high start launch, and hand launch that are separate for the sake of 8. launch, flight & landing safety.
- Flying over the parking/pit areas at less than 30 feet is prohibited. Doing so in competition WILL result in a zero 9. flight score and during R/R flying a disciplinary action by the club.
- 10. No aerobatics or speed runs over the parking/pit/Launch/Landing zones.
- Do not launch if a plane is circling in a launch zone: vacate the launch zone as soon as possible if someone is 11. waiting to launch.
- 12. When entering a thermal occupied by other aircraft, enter in the same direction as the first aircraft
- 13. Landing aircraft have the right of way!

- 14. In the event of no mechanical retriever, please shag your own chute/line for the flight
  - Please share the usage of club equipment so that all have equal flight time.
- Please be courteous and helpful to your fellow flyers as well as informative to all guests/spectators. Enjoy 16. yourself and others!!
  - Absolutely no debris or trash is to be left on the field! Please take it home with you for disposal.
- Make sure that your plane and electronics are airworthy before each flight. Exercise good safety sense in your 18. flight
- 19. The aircraft will have an identification name/address or AMA number on or in the model in case of loss.
- 20. You MUST tag your winch/high start spikes or stakes with fluorescent tape so they are easily spotted on the field by all concerned. Members may be fined \$10 for each stake or nail not so marked. Previous damage to sod farm equipment from spikes left in the ground has made this rule EXTREMELY important.
- 21. Absolutely no alcoholic beverages will be consumed, prior to or during participation in any model event on the flying field.


