Sunday 22nd September Competition Report

Normally the September contest is our annual Colorado Challenge Cup event. Because of the flooding we needed to postpone it 2 weeks, and that did not line up with the PPSS schedule so we instead made the Sept contest a normal club contest and the October event will be the Challenge Cup. We had 7 pilots show up for the contest, 5 masters and 2 sportsmen. Now 7 is a difficult number for MoM scheduling, but we made it work thanks to Terry G who was flying an electric. Terry always flew in the first group of 4 and the timer for lane 3 also timed for Terry. It was a fun contest getting 8 rounds of flying in with some quite challenging conditions. For example, the best score of the first round was 6:41! Every pilot had at least one hit with a score less than 900 normalized. In the end Mike Verzuh won the event with one hit and a nick...

In the Sportsman group Tom Tate won the class with some good flying. Tom actually won round 4 with a 9:55 70 beating both Lenny and myself! Tom has not been flying much and was a little rusty – but with some more practice he will be dangerous. Terry struggled a bit as the conditions were tough for his electric plane.

The main thing is we all had fun – and that is the main goal. I hope to see a bunch of pilots out for the Challenge Cup in October.

Sunday September 8th-DLG Report CD Shawn Curry

I advertised this contest on RC Groups as possibly our last chance this year to have a summer weather DLG contest. After the last few weeks, I'm not so sure what summer weather is in Colorado. Nevertheless, we were treated to a hot day with little wind and surprisingly troublesome soaring conditions. In seven rounds of flying only one task saw pilots achieve maximum times. Gary Jensen, Dave Runyon, and Brandon Blair all flew their two minute flights in the ladder. The next best rounds flown were Bowdie Ormsbee dropping 36s in 1,2,3,4 and John Jonke dropping 37s in 5x2. In the end Brandon Blair came out on top with 5795 points, Bowdie Ormsbee and John Jonke came in second and third with a close 5696 and 5651 points respectively. Round winners were walking off the field shaking their heads, sure they had just flown their dropped round. After four rounds of flying, Harold had to leave, and "Guest One" Runyon thought he'd have to too, but didn't (glad you could stay Dave). We re-jiggered the flight groups to fly two heats rather than three per round. This complicated scoring a little, so let me know if you spot an error, especially if it benefits my score!

If you're thinking of becoming a contest CD, and are worried about messing things up, don't sweat it just do it. This was my first attempt at CDing and I think it went smoothly. No one threw a transmitter at my head anyway. With the help of easy to use scoring software and especially Bob Pederson's help I was able to run the contest, enter scores, and fly. Thanks Bob!

ROCKY MOUNTAIN SOARING ASSOCIATION FIELD RULES

- 1. The sod farm operations take precedence over **ALL** activities. We use the field at the convenience of the owner.
- 2. All members will follow ALL instructions from ANY sod farm personnel without question.
- 3. When sod farm operations are occurring during a flying session it is **OUR** responsibility to ensure that we will not interfere with operations. If it is unclear as to what is happening or where they intend to mow or work try to talk to workers or management and always move equipment or vacate the premises if necessary. Some workers do not speak very good English in that case you must make every effort to avoid conflict or interference with operations.
- 4. Park only in the designated parking areas Do not park on grass, dirt or roads.
- 5. Avoid setting up on newly seeded areas or young grassy areas. The nice grassy areas are better to land on anyway!
- 6. Establish a frequency control pole and tag system! Frequency control is to be in effect at all times!! All members will post their frequency control tags on the pole and if there are conflicts, please exercise safety sense as well as share the flight time.
- 7. Parking and pit areas should be as condensed as possible for the safety of launch and landing.
- 8. Establish flight line areas for winch launch, high start launch, and hand launch that are separate for the sake of launch, flight & landing safety.
- 9. Flying over the parking/pit areas at less than 30 feet is prohibited. Doing so in competition WILL result in a zero flight score and during R/R flying a disciplinary action by the club.
- 10. No aerobatics or speed runs over the parking/pit/Launch/Landing zones.
- 11. Do not launch if a plane is circling in a launch zone: vacate the launch zone as soon as possible if someone is waiting to launch.
- 12. When entering a thermal occupied by other aircraft, enter in the same direction as the first aircraft
- 13. Landing aircraft have the right of way!
- 14. In the event of no mechanical retriever, please shag your own chute/line for the flight
- 15. Please share the usage of club equipment so that all have equal flight time.
- 16. Please be courteous and helpful to your fellow flyers as well as informative to all guests/spectators. Enjoy yourself and others!!
- 17. Absolutely no debris or trash is to be left on the field! Please take it home with you for disposal.
- 18. Make sure that your plane and electronics are airworthy before each flight. Exercise good safety sense in your flight
- 19. The aircraft will have an identification name/address or AMA number on or in the model in case of loss.
- 20. You MUST tag your winch/high start spikes or stakes with fluorescent tape so they are easily spotted on the field by all concerned. Members may be fined \$10 for each stake or nail not so marked. Previous damage to sod farm equipment from spikes left in the ground has made this rule EXTREMELY important.
- 21. Absolutely no alcoholic beverages will be consumed, prior to or during participation in any model event on the flying field.
