# PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Well – the weather has not really cooperated over the last month. There were a couple of unusually good days, followed by long periods of crap weather. The GPS (Grumpy Pilot Syndrome) is setting in. Several of us are looking forward to the annual jaunt to Phoenix for F3J in the Desert and Southwest Classic. We are hoping for nice warm weather as break in this longish winter... Thanks again to John Lovins for volunteering to drive the trailer with all our stuff – this would be many times harder without that support!!! I run the F3JD event every year and it continues to grow. This year I filled the original pilot limit up in 5 hours... I expanded the lanes by 1 and the teams by 1 to accommodate all the wait list people. There are now 71 pilots registered. We are outgrowing the venue...

You should also know that Mike Verzuh has been instrumental in forming a new USA F3J Championship Series. The intent is to further the development and participation of F3J in the USA. There are 7 events currently participating across the USA. Pilots use the totals from their best 3 events in the series to compete for the championship. It is hoped that as the series grows there will ultimately be cash prize awards for the top pilots. There is a board of directors responsible for forming the basis of the series and organizing everything around it. The board consists of:

We had a very good meeting for our annual kickoff and scheduling meeting in January. It was well attended with lots of good discussion. There were several items that resulted from that meeting that were placed before the board for action. Here is a list of the items and the results:

## • RMSA Schedule.

The schedule has been set and approved. The updated schedule is on the RMSA website. Please direct any changes or additions to my attention.

# Purchase of digital clock for F3K events/

Much discussion of this item occurred. In the final result the board disapproved this expenditure for the present, but would reconsider with information that addresses the board's concern. The board believes that the system intended for purchase has not been developed enough to ensure reliable

usage during events. If and when the system becomes truly reliable and useable the board will reconsider this decision and approve such purchase. There was some discussion that the clock also needed to support F3J events, but there is no development in process for that to happen so that will not be a consideration for the board in reconsidering the purchase.

• Creation and Purchase of a perpetual DLG trophy equivalent to the Unlimited trophy. This was approved. The DLG coordinators will determine and order the appropriate award and be reimbursed by the club. No specific dollar amount was allocated – it is expected that the award will be "reasonable".

### DLG Club Dues

There was discussion that a significant portion of the club operating budget is allocated towards items that are not used by DLG members and they felt it was unfair for the dues from DLG members be used towards TD expenses. As a result it was proposed and approved to reduce the DLG club membership dues to \$15. The website has been updated to reflect this new membership class.

### Contest Fees

It was proposed and approved that contest fees be returned to their normal rates as collected prior to the last year and qualified as follows: It is expected that attendees of more than one contest per year that live in Colorado be required to be club members. The first contest for new members is free. After that normal contest rates apply. Juniors (under 18) would be exempted from contest fees.

## • Reimbursement of U-Haul trailer rental fees.

• It was requested that the club reimburse trailer rental fees when a trailer is rented to haul club member gear to distant events when the club trailer is in use by another part of the club. The board decided to consider this on an as-required basis, not a blanket authorization. If this is a need for some reason the requestor needs to ask the board in advance for such reimbursement authorization and provide the reason for the request and the dates that conflict with club trailer usage.

### • Trailer Insurance.

As some of you know we recently had a break-in of the trailer. The good news is that they seemed to only be looking for tools. They left all of the equipment in the trailer alone except for a few items: 1) the transit used to lay out the J fields, 2) the 2 tool boxes. These contained only a few hand tools of minimal value. For us the bigger loss is one of the boxes contained spare parts for the winches. We lost some solenoids, belts, arms, wires switches etc. We will need to replace these items. 3) Softside tool box. I'm sure they thought this was tools, but it actually contained speakers for the sound system. These also need to be replaced. Fortunately I had taken the computers and the actual sound system home to work on them over the winter so those were not taken either.

From a cost perspective we were VERY lucky. It would be very expensive to replace all the winches if someone decided to take them. Likewise if someone stole the trailer it would be very bad news...

As a result I am looking at the cost of insurance to cover the following:

The trailer itself and the equipment inside for loss from theft, vandalism or fire

The trailer and contents when used to transport member planes and equipment

I will provide detailed information to the club considering coverage and cost for consideration at a future meeting.

There is an outstanding proposal to be presented, discussed and voted on AT THE CLUB MEETING that will provide a new club champion Class/Award. In general this Award is intended to provide incentive and recognition for cross discipline soaring accomplishment. It will require participation in at least 2, possibly 3, different soaring events and encourages participation in both club DLG and club open events as well as national level events. If you want to be a part of the discussion and the voting electorate, then you will need to be at the meeting. In accordance with the club by-laws there is a quorum if there are at least 8 club members present. Please show up and participate in your club's future...

I look forward to seeing each of you there...

# **SOD FARM UPDATE by John Lovins**

There are going to be a couple of changes at the sod farm this year. Right now they are rebuilding the sprinkler with new pipe and will be extending it out to its normal position. That means very soon we will be parking in the traditional spots by the access road, not out on the field as we have been doing. It's VERY important to not make any tracks in soft ground or good grass. A sod farm employee was recently fired for doing that.

Also the bird hunters are active now so please respect them and stay to the south side. Barriers are up to restrict access, and will be removed in the spring as always.

As to where we will be flying, they will be cutting in the SE corner this spring and reworking the outside ring that has not been used for a couple of years. When the time comes I'm told we will move to the NE corner. For now stay in the SE corner and obey any request from sod farm employees. Ill keep you updated.

Maintaining access to this great field is everyone's responsibility by respecting the sod farms wishes. If you have any questions or problems please contact me so we can resolve them quickly without creating a problem for them. We want to continue to be a pleasant distraction for them, not a PITA.



# ROCKY MOUNTAIN SOARING ASSOCIATION FIELD RULES

- 1. The sod farm operations take precedence over **ALL** activities. We use the field at the convenience of the owner
- 2. All members will follow **ALL** instructions from **ANY** sod farm personnel without question.
- 3. When sod farm operations are occurring during a flying session it is **OUR** responsibility to ensure that we will not interfere with operations. If it is unclear as to what is happening or where they intend to mow or work try to talk to workers or management and always move equipment or vacate the premises if necessary. Some workers do not speak very good English in that case you must make every effort to avoid conflict or interference with operations.
- 4. Park only in the designated parking areas Do not park on grass, dirt or roads.
- 5. Avoid setting up on newly seeded areas or young grassy areas. The nice grassy areas are better to land on anyway!
- 6. Establish a frequency control pole and tag system! Frequency control is to be in effect at all times!! All members will post their frequency control tags on the pole and if there are conflicts, please exercise safety sense as well as share the flight time.
- 7. Parking and pit areas should be as condensed as possible for the safety of launch and landing.
- 8. Establish flight line areas for winch launch, high start launch, and hand launch that are separate for the sake of launch, flight & landing safety.
- 9. Flying over the parking/pit areas at less than 30 feet is prohibited. Doing so in competition WILL result in a zero flight score and during R/R flying a disciplinary action by the club.
- 10. No aerobatics or speed runs over the parking/pit/Launch/Landing zones.
- 11. Do not launch if a plane is circling in a launch zone: vacate the launch zone as soon as possible if someone is waiting to launch.
- 12. When entering a thermal occupied by other aircraft, enter in the same direction as the first aircraft
- 13. Landing aircraft have the right of way!
- 14. In the event of no mechanical retriever, please shag your own chute/line for the flight
- 15. Please share the usage of club equipment so that all have equal flight time.
- 16. Please be courteous and helpful to your fellow flyers as well as informative to all guests/spectators. Enjoy yourself and others!!
- 17. Absolutely no debris or trash is to be left on the field! Please take it home with you for disposal.
- 18. Make sure that your plane and electronics are airworthy before each flight. Exercise good safety sense in your flight
- 19. The aircraft will have an identification name/address or AMA number on or in the model in case of loss.
- 20. You MUST tag your winch/high start spikes or stakes with fluorescent tape so they are easily spotted on the field by all concerned. Members may be fined \$10 for each stake or nail not so marked. Previous damage to sod farm equipment from spikes left in the ground has made this rule EXTREMELY important.
- 21. Absolutely no alcoholic beverages will be consumed, prior to or during participation in any model event on the flying field.

Take I-76 to exit 16. Turn left and follow the frontage road to the stoplight and turn east onto 120<sup>th</sup> eastbound towards the airport. Take 120<sup>th</sup> East to Tower Rd. Take 120th east of Tower Rd about 3/4 miles. We fly on the

North side of 120th which is the SE quadrant of the sod farm. *Flying for RMSA members and accompanied guests only.*
