Colorado in the Winter, ahhh, we have lots of nice flying days interspersed with a few crappy days. I hope everyone is getting out and getting some air time. First we'll cover some club business. I am sending out a gift of TicketMaster Gift Certificates to Don Schlup, the owner of Scienturfic in appreciation for his generosity in allowing us the use of the fields we use. I am also sending a couple of movie passes to the supervisory staff as well. Remember to always be polite and accommodating to the needs of the sod farm staff when using the grounds. Note that goose hunting is still going on and we need to share the fields with the hunters. They are only there for a few months in the winter, so please be respectful and avoid flying in the quadrants they are in. We can use any quadrant, but frequency control is more difficult if we are wandering around. We have moved general flying to the EAST field and we should generally be setting up and flying there. That is where the frequency flag is. If the hunters are on that field you may move to a free quadrant, but we should use the flag on the east field for frequency control. Always check for frequency clips on the east field and do NOT fly anywhere if there is a clip there already on your frequency.

We had a great meeting last month and got the 2005 schedule all set up. Thanks to several volunteers, each CD only needs to run one contest this year. A big thank you to all of the CDs. We have a full agenda of events this year. We have a bid in to host the US F3J team selections again this year. We will know at the end of April the status of our bid. If we win we will need plenty of help to have a contest as successful as the last TS. We will again host the Scienturfic Appreciation and Family Day this year. It was a big success last year. The timing on that event is only tentative because we try to schedule it with the harvesting schedule so the farm employees have time to attend. Handlaunch Corner by John Kappus

With the great weather that we had recently, I've had the chance to go out and fly. This has really reminded my about why hand launch is my favorite type of flying. I have difficulty finding large blocks of time to fly, but enjoy getting out at lunch. First, this gets me out of work, which is always a good thing. It also gets me looking away from the computer and staring off into the distance. Hand launch is perfect for these short sessions because they fit into the car as one piece, can be flown from a small field almost anywhere, and the catch and release style of thermal hunting provides plenty of thermaling practice in a short amount of time. I have also found that discus launch has helped my enjoyment. With javelin throw, I had to throw pretty hard to really have much of a chance to thermal out. With discus launch, I can be rather casual and still get plenty of altitude to range around in search of lift. I believe that hand launch really improves my flying too. There is defiantly a challenge to coring a small low altitude thermal and this practice helps smooth out my flying while I'm close enough to the ground to really see what's going on. All those launch and landings also helps in the Thermal Duration landing circle too. A hand launch, particularly a poly without flaps or spoilers, teaches energy management on the final approach. I've always done well in the landing circle in Open Class, but it's definitely not from practicing with a full house sailplane! I can think of no better way to spend my lunch hour then outside with my 1.5 meter plane. Come out and join me some lunchtime if you find yourself out in Louisville. I even saw that the for sale section have a good DLG in there.

Last weeks article talked about the use of a flat peg to replace the ¼" round peg used in a lots of DLGs. Mark Drela has recently added one more pertinent comment to this issue. He writes:

Just for the record, the numbers I posted on SALglider indicate that a low-drag peg has the biggest benefit in a fast glide (e.g. upwind penetration). The effect on the launch is smaller.

At my first DLG contest, run by Denny, I flew my SG1 (8.5 oz) unballasted in 15 mph wind, without landing out even once. I now think one reason I was able to pull this off was my blade peg I was using. I calculate that the following two gliders will have the same apparent L/D going into a 5 m/s (11 mph) wind:

8.5 oz AUW, 0.06" thick blade peg, (actual SG1) 10.5 oz AUW, 1/4" round peg, (hypothetical SG1)

So switching from the 1/4" round peg to the blade peg buys roughly the same penetration improvement as adding 2 oz of ballast (!!!). The lighter glider will of course have a lower minimum sink rate.

ROCKY MOUNTAIN SOARING ASSOCIATION FIELD RULES

- 1. The sod farm operations take precedence over **ALL** activities. We use the field at the convenience of the owner.
- 2. All members will follow **ALL** instructions from **ANY** sod farm personnel without question.
- 3. When sod farm operations are occurring during a flying session it is **OUR** responsibility to ensure that we will not interfere with operations. If it is unclear as to what is happening or where they intend to mow or work try to talk to workers or management and always move equipment or vacate the premises if necessary. Some workers do not speak very good English - in that case you must make every effort to avoid conflict or interference with operations.
- 4. Park only in the designated parking areas Do not park on grass, dirt or roads.
- Avoid setting up on newly seeded areas or young grassy areas. The nice grassy areas are better to land on anyway! 5.
- Establish a frequency control pole and tag system! Frequency control is to be in effect at all times!! All members will post their 6. frequency control tags on the pole and if there are conflicts, please exercise safety sense as well as share the flight time.
- 7. Parking and pit areas should be as condensed as possible for the safety of launch and landing.
- 8. Establish flight line areas for winch launch, high start launch, and hand launch that are separate for the sake of launch, flight & landing safety.
- 9. Flying over the parking/pit areas at less than 30 feet is prohibited. Doing so in competition WILL result in a zero flight score and during R/R flying a disciplinary action by the club.
- No aerobatics or speed runs over the parking/pit/Launch/Landing zones. 10.
- 11. Do not launch if a plane is circling in a launch zone: vacate the launch zone as soon as possible if someone is waiting to launch.
- 12. When entering a thermal occupied by other aircraft, enter in the same direction as the first aircraft
- Landing aircraft have the right of way! 13.
- In the event of no mechanical retriever, please shag your own chute/line for the flight 14.
- 15. Please share the usage of club equipment so that all have equal flight time.
- 16. Please be courteous and helpful to your fellow flyers as well as informative to all guests/spectators. Enjoy yourself and others!!
- 17. Absolutely no debris or trash is to be left on the field! Please take it home with you for disposal.
- 18. Make sure that your plane and electronics are airworthy before each flight. Exercise good safety sense in your flight
- 19. The aircraft will have an identification name/address or AMA number on or in the model in case of loss.
- 20. You MUST tag your winch/high start spikes or stakes with fluorescent tape so they are easily spotted on the field by all concerned. Members may be fined \$10 for each stake or nail not so marked. Previous damage to sod farm equipment from spikes

	left in the ground have made this rule EXTREMELY important.
21.	Absolutely no alcoholic beverages will be consumed, prior to or during participation in any model event on the flying field.
